The Planning Commission took the following action:

Consider a request to rezone a tract of land located in the 14th Civil District on the east side of State Route 36 approximately 350 feet north of its intersection with Dillow Drive from R-1 to M-1 to permit the location of an office, warehouse and repair shap for Jarvis Trucking.

Bill Jarvis was present representing the applicant and spoke in support of the application. Mr. Jarvis outlined his plane to construct a trucking terminal on the property. Bill Brook, 397 Dillow Drive and Gary Taylor, and other residents of the Dillow Drive neighborhood spoke in opposition to the proposed zoning citing potential negative impact on the livability and safety of the single family residential neighborhood that would result from increased truck traffic on Dillow Drive, a narrow, winding county road not designed for heavy truck use. County commissioner Blaicok addressed the commission and opined that the proposed zoning would lead to traffic conditions on state Route 36 on the south side of the Moats property requiring costly construction of acceleration and deceleration and turn larres to serve the proposed truck terminal. Staff stated that the proposed trucking facility could create unsafe traffic conditions on Dillow Drive, and SR 36 – the two roads giving access to the property - insofar as the roads are not designed for or capable of safely accommodating anticipated truck traffic from the Moats property. Staff noted that the proposed M-1 industrial zoning would not be compatible with existing residential development and that the introduction of a non-residential use into the residential neighborhood would increase traffic and create conditions dangerous to residents and beir children and disruptive to the peace and quiet of existing homes, as woll as negatively impacting residential property values.

Staff recommended that application 1/93-3, a request to rezone the Fred P. Moats Property from existing R-1 residential to M-1 Industrial be denied.

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SAM M. FEATHERS BRIDGE

The first one-Isne bridge was constructed about 1913 and was widened to two-lanes about 1952. Before that time it was necessary to ford the creek on a horse or use a swinging bridge, one located upstream at Galloway's Mill and another swinging bridge located downstream near Old Buffalo School and Church.

Sam Feathers donated land for the bridge located in the Buffalo Community of Sulfivan County, the also gave land for nearby roads that bordered or ran through his property on each side of Beaver Creek, namely Buffalo Road, Beaver Creek Road, Jake Cross Road, Thompson Road, and Morrell Road (now Massengill Park Road).

He was instrumental in building Buffalo School, located across the creek from his home. Ut now serves a a community center-called-"Buffalo Ruritan Clubhouse".

Sam Feathers was a farmer, and at different times served as a Sullivan County Magistrate. He was a guard at the Sullivan County Jail, a Deputy Sberiff and for a short time he operated a small grocery store near his home. He retired from the Mead Corporation in Kingsport, Tennessee, where he worked as a security guard.

He was a member of the Whiteside Lodge (Oddfellows) at Bluff City, Tennessee. He was a member of Buffalo Shristian Churchy, where he served as an Elder. Preachers were frequent visitors for Sunday dinner at the Feathers family table.

Sam Feathers was born in 1884, died in 1973 at age 89, having lived his entire life in Sullivan County, Tennessea. He and his wife, Faye Webb Feathers, were the parents of ten children (Ed, Brainerd, Nancy Mulèm, Mable Rader, WX York, Sam, Asenath Crussell, Earl, Oakley, and DonAdd). Five sons served in the United States Military Service.

He was a good neighbor, helping his firm fellowman in any way he could. Many people, neighbors and strangers alike, were welcome to pump water from a well located in them Feathers yard. During dry summer months many springs ran drym ar her just "went dry" completely, and their water supply came from this well.

An example of his concern for young people was working to help a young man who was blinded in a hunting adcident to sttend a school for the Blind in Knoxville. This enabled the young man to return home and operate his own grocery store. In time this young man married and was the father of a daughter. When the daughter needed help with health problems, Sam Feathers helped her get proper care. Now the daughter is an adult and serves as "eyes" for her blind father much of the time.

We, the family of Sam M. Feathers, request that them new bridge be called the XXMM, "Sam M. Feathers Bridge".
