WHEREAS, our Government was founded upon a trust in God, that began when our Founding Fathers proclaimed in America's first official document, our Declaration of Independence, that our rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, were not given to us by government, but by God, "our Creator, the Sovereign Judge of the Universe"; and,

WHEREAS, it is fact that between 90% and 95% of those who drafted and signed the U.S. Constitution had a strong belief and trust in God and never intended that there be a separation between God and the affairs of Government, only that each citizen be free to choose on a personal basis how to worship or if to worship; and,

RESOLUTION TO Authorize Retirement Credit for Military Service Rendered in the Armed Forces During the Persian Gulf War

WHEREAS, T.C.A. § 8-34-605(c)(1)(A)(ii) provides that any member who leaves or left services with the State of Tennessee or any political subdivision thereof participating pursuant to T.C.A. Title 8, Chapter 35, Part 2 in order to perform military duty in the armed forces of the United States during the Persian Gulf War, and who is reemployed by the State of Tennessee or a participating political subdivision within six (6) months after being relieved of such military duty shall have the option to establish retirement credit for such military service without charge to the member. The Persian Gulf War means the period from and including August 2, 1990 to the date thereafter prescribed by presidential proclamation or by federal law.

WHEREAS, credit for such military service may only be granted under the following conditions:

- 1. The credit cannot be established in any other retirement system;
- 2. The member was honorably discharged from such military service;
- 3. The credit shall be granted conditionally upon the member becoming vested; prior to vesting, the credit may not be used to establish any rights under this system;
- 4. In no case shall retirement credit granted for such military service be combined with any other military service credit granted exceed an aggregate of four years.

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners on May 19, 1997 approved Resolution No. 2 authorizing the adoption of Regulations Governing Health and Safety Standards of Residential and Non-Residential Properties in Sullivan County, which Regulations need to be amended;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of
 Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session on the 19th day of April, 2004
 hereby amend the Regulations Governing Health and Safety Standards of Residential and
 Non-Residential Properties in Sullivan County such that said Regulations now shall read as
 follows:

According to Tennessee Code Annotated §39-14-504, §5-1-115 and other authority including the general police power of the county and in the interest of the public good and the safety and welfare of the people, counties, by resolution of their legislative bodies may impose regulation concerning the maintenance, condition and occupancy of residential and nonresidential properties; and

These regulations may be imposed in order:

- (1) To protect the public health, safety and welfare of all residents by establishing minimum standards governing the maintenance, condition and occupancy of residential and nonresidential premises;
- (2) To fix certain responsibilities and duties upon owners, operators, and occupants;
- (3) To authorize and establish procedures for the inspection of residential and nonresidential premises; and
- (4) To fix penalties for violations of these minimum standards and provide a means of repair, demolition or vacation of premises unfit for human habitation or use.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS OF RESIDENTIAL AND NON-RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES

SECTION I – APPOINTMENT OF ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

This resolution shall be enforced by an individual, under the supervision of the Sullivan County Building Commissioner, who shall be known as the Sullivan County Code Enforcement Officer (hereinafter "Enforcement Officer") appointed by the County Mayor subject to confirmation by the county legislative body.

SECTION II – PROPERTY STANDARDS

(a) A structure is unfit for human occupation or use and, therefore, unlawful if conditions exist in or around such structure which are dangerous or injurious to the health or safety of the occupants of such structure, the occupants of neighboring structures or other residents of the county, assuming ordinary health and sensibilities; such conditions may include: defects therein increasing the hazards of fire, accidents or other calamities; dilapidation; disrepair; structural defects; and/or unsanitary conditions.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any owner of property to create, maintain or permit to be maintained
on property the obvious neglect and overgrowth of vines, grass, underbrush and/or the
accumulation of discarded or worthless personal property, debris, trash, litter, garbage, rubbish,
refuse, etc., or any combination of the preceding elements, or a vacant dilapidated building or
structure, or to encourage the infestation of rats or other harmful animals, so as to endanger the
health, safety, or welfare of other citizens of ordinary health and sensibility.

(c) It shall be unlawful to allow any violation identified in subsections (a) or (b) above to exist or continue in, on or around any building, structure or property affected by this resolution.

SECTION III--- OWNER AND OCCUPANT RESPONSIBILITIES

It is the obligation of the owner(s) of property to maintain such property so as not to endanger the health, safety, or welfare of county residents and/or so as not to violate the terms of these Regulations. If said property fails to comply with the above-stated regulations, the property owner(s) is responsible and liable.

SECTION IV – INSPECTION PROCEDURES

Whenever the Enforcement Officer on his own can visibly observe from a public road that violation(s) of any of these Regulations exist, the Enforcement Officer shall, after making a preliminary investigation which discloses a basis for such violation(s), issue and cause to be served upon the owner of record of such properties a notice stating the violations and requesting the condition to be remedied immediately.

SECTION V --- PENALTIES AND REMEDIES FOR VIOLATIONS

(a) For owners of and parties in interest of properties found by the Enforcement Office to be in violation of the above-mentioned regulations, a notice of violation shall be given by personal service upon the owner or by United States Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, addressed to the last known address of the owner(s) of record. The notice of violation shall state that the owner of the property is entitled to a hearing. The notice of violation shall be written in plain language and shall also include, but not be limited to, the following elements:

(1) A brief statement of the violations and date noted;

(2) A brief statement of Tennessee Code Annotated §5-1-115 which shall contain the consequences and penalty of failing to remedy the violation;

(3) The person, office, address and telephone number of the department or person giving notice;

(4) A cost estimate for remedying the noted condition which shall be in conformity with the standards of cost in the community; and

(5) A place wherein the notified party may return a copy of the notice of violation indicating the desire for a hearing or waiver of hearing and agreement to remedy.

If the whereabouts of the owner(s) of record is unknown and the same cannot be ascertained by the Enforcement Officer in the exercise of reasonable diligence or if for any reason notice by Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, cannot be obtained, and the Enforcement Officer shall make a written statement to that effect, then the serving of such notice of violation upon such person(s) may be made by publishing the same one (1) time in a newspaper of general circulation in Sullivan County. A copy of such notice of violation shall also be posted in a conspicuous place on the premises affected by the notice.

(b) A copy of such notice of violation may also be filed for record in the office of register of deeds for the county and such filing of the notice of violation shall have the same force and effects as other lis pendes notices provided by law.

(c) Upon receipt of the notice of violation as provided hereinabove, the property owner shall
 proceed forthwith to take appropriate measure to comply with these regulations. The county shall
 provide for a hearing upon request by an aggrieved property owner, said hearing to be held
 before the Enforcement Officer.

A request for hearing shall be made within thirty (30) days following receipt of said notice of violation. If the property owner timely requests a hearing as provided herein, the Enforcement Officer shall, within a reasonable time following the receipt of the request for hearing, upon a record hold a hearing to review and reconsider the appropriateness of the requirements imposed on the property owner and the cost of remedying the condition. The time period established herein shall be stayed pending review by the Enforcement Officer. Failure to make the request for a hearing within the time limit allowed by this regulation shall, without exception, constitute a waiver of right to a hearing and judicial review. Immediately following the hearing, the Enforcement Officer may:

- (1) Grant a continuance at the request of either party if the Enforcement Officer considers the continuance appropriate;
- (2) Dismiss the notice of violation and such notice shall become ineffective;
 - (3) Confirm the notice of violation; or
 - (4) Modify the notice of violation.

(d) Any person who disagrees with the final decision of the Enforcement Officer after having
 held a hearing under the provisions of this resolution may seek judicial review of same. The
 time period established herein shall be stayed pending judicial review.

(e) If the owner fails to comply with the notice within thirty (30) days of receipt of same, subject to stay pending review and any modifications made pursuant to review as provided for above, the

Enforcement Officer may cause such property to be repaired, altered or improved or be vacated and closed, removed or demolished as necessary to remedy the condition and the costs shall be assessed against the owner of the property. Upon performance, the actual cost of such repairs, alterations or improvements or vacating and closing or removal or demolition shall upon the filing of a notice with the office of the register of deeds be a lien in favor of the county against the real property on which such cost was incurred, second only to liens of the state and county for taxes, any lien of the county for special assessments, and any valid lien, right or interest in such property duly recorded or duly perfected by filing prior to the filing of such notice. Such notice shall identify the owner of record of the real property, contain the property address, describe the property sufficiently to identify it and recite the amount of the obligation secured by the lien. These costs shall be collected by the County Trustee at the same time and in the same manner as property taxes are collected.

(f) Owner(s), individually and/or jointly, of property found to be in violation of these Regulations shall be subject to a penalty of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each violation. Each and every day during which such illegal condition or use exists or continues is deemed a separate violation.

SECTION VI – EXCEPTIONS

(a) The provisions of this resolution shall apply county-wide exclusive of incorporated municipalities lying within Sullivan County.

(b) The provisions of Section V(e) of this resolution permitting Sullivan County to remedy conditions pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated §5-1-115(c) shall not apply to any parcel of property upon which an owner-occupied residence is located.

(c) This resolution shall not apply to any business operated pursuant to the Tennessee Solid Waste Disposal Act, Tennessee Code Annotated §68-31-101, et seq.

SECTION VII – RULES

(a) The county governing body and/or the Enforcement Officer may establish any rules and regulations necessary for the administration and enforcement of this resolution.

- (b) The Enforcement Officer shall keep the following:
 - (i) All complaints filed with the Enforcement Officer;
 - (ii) The address including the civil district of any property in violation of this resolution;
 - (iii) All notices delivered to property owners found to be in violation of this resolution and any expenses associated therewith;
 - (iv) All waivers of hearing and agreements to remedy;
 - (v) All requests for hearing received;
 - (vi) Decisions issued by the Enforcement Officer after hearings;

.

(vii) All records of the hearings including evidence, minutes and recordation of hearing;

(viii) All request for judicial review and final decision of the judicial review.

SECTION VIII -- CONSTITUTIONALITY AND CONFLICT WITH OTHER RESOLUTIONS

If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this resolution shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, provision, or portion of this resolution which is not of itself invalid or unconstitutional.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that outside counsel employed to assist in enforcing the provisions of this resolution shall be employed by contract which shall be executed by the County Mayor and the County Attorney and all costs associated therewith shall be paid from the Self-Insurance Fund.

RESOLUTION To Authorize Temporary Financing Of Highway (State Aid) Projects By The Issuance Of Capital Outlay Notes Not To Exceed \$1,000,000

WHEREAS, the governing body of Sullivan County, Tennessee has determined that State-Aid funding for roads and bridges in Sullivan County has accumulated to exceed \$1,000,000 as of this date and is expected to increase for the 2004-2005 fiscal year; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable to provide the temporary financing for these public works projects for the county with state reimbursement at a ratio of 75/25; and,

WHEREAS, the regular operating budget for the Sullivan County Highway Fund has funding available in the Personnel, Materials & Supplies Account, etc. appropriated to pay the County's twenty-five percent (25%) portion; and,

WHEREAS, six projects totaling \$781,000 have already been set up by the state and can be started immediately, these include:

Bunker Hill- Chinquapin Grove Rd. Old Jonesboro Road Vance Tank Road Massengill-Seneker Lane Rock Springs Road (1) Reservoir Road Elizabethton Hwy. Rock Springs Road (2)

The remainder of the state earmarked funds can be set up for additional projects after the new contract prices for asphalt, etc. are available; and,

WHEREAS, the seventy-five percent share (75%) to be reimbursed by the State must be expended before reimbursements will be made by the State of Tennessee; and,

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Parts I, IV and VI of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Act"); local governments in Tennessee are authorized to finance the cost of this Project through the issuance and sale of interest bearing capital outlay notes upon the approval of the State Director of Local Finance; and,

WHEREAS, under provisions of T.C.A. Section 9-21-408 of Title 9, Chapter 21, local governments in Tennessee are authorized to make interfund loans in accordance with procedures for issuance of notes in part. VIII of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated; and,

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Commission finds that it is advantageous to the Sullivan County to authorize the issuance of capital outlay notes to finance the cost of the Project and repay the loan upon receipt of the State funds;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan
 County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby approves:

Section 1. That, for the purpose of providing funds to finance the cost of the Project in and for
 Sullivan County, the County Mayor of Sullivan County is hereby authorized in accordance with the
 terms of this resolution to issue and sell interest-bearing capital outlay notes in a principal amount
 not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) the "Notes" at either a competitive public sale or at a

private negotiated sale upon approval of the State Director of Local Finance pursuant to the terms, provisions, and conditions permitted by law. The Notes shall be designated "State Road Projects" Capital Outlay Notes, Series 2004, shall be number serially from 1 upwards; shall be dated as of the date of issuance; shall be in a denomination(s) as agreed upon with the purchaser at a rate or rates not to exceed three and one-half percent (3.5%) per annum, and in no event shall the rate exceed the legal limit provided by law.

Section 2. That, the Notes shall mature not later than two (2) years after the date of issuance
and that the Notes and any extension or renewal notes shall not exceed the reasonably expected
economic life of the Project, which is hereby certified by the Governing Body to be at least 10 years.
Provided however, that each year the Notes are outstanding, one-half (1/2), but in no event not less
than one-fourth (1/4), of the original principal amount of the Notes shall mature without renewal
but subject to prior redemption.

15 Section 3. That, the Notes shall be subject to redemption at the option of Sullivan County in 16 whole or in part, at any time, at the principal amount and accrued interest to the date of 17 redemption.

18 That, the Notes shall be direct general obligations of Sullivan County for which the 19 Section 4. punctual payment of the principal and interest on the notes, the full faith and credit of Sullivan 20 County is irrevocably pledged and Sullivan County hereby pledges its taxing power as to all taxable 21 property in Sullivan County for purpose of providing funds for the payment of principal of and 22 interest on the Notes. The governing body of Sullivan County hereby authorizes the levy and 23 collection of a special tax on all taxable property of Sullivan County over and above all other taxes 24 authorized by Sullivan County to create a sinking fund to retire the Notes with interest as they 25 mature in an amount necessary for that purpose. The Notes shall be further secured by revenues 26 generated by State Aid funds. 27

28 29 Section 5. That, the Notes shall be executed in the name of Sullivan County and bear the 30 manual signature of the County Mayor of Sullivan County and the manual signature of the County Clerk with the local government seal affixed thereon; and shall be payable as to principal and 31 interest at the Sullivan County Office of Accounts and Budgets or the paying agent duly appointed 32 by Sullivan County. Proceeds of the Notes shall be deposited with the banking institution of 33 Sullivan County and shall be paid out for the purpose of financing the Project pursuant to this 34 Resolution and as required by law. 35

Section 6. That, the Notes will be issued in fully registered form and that at all times during 37 which any Notes remains outstanding and unpaid, Sullivan county or its agent shall keep or cause 38 to be kept at its office a note register, if held by an agent of Sullivan County, shall at all times be 39 open for inspection by Sullivan County or any duly authorized officer of Sullivan County. Each 40 Note shall have the qualities and incidents of a negotiable instrument and shall be transferable only 41 42 upon the note register kept by Sullivan County or its agent, by the registered owner of the Note in person or by the registered owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, upon presentation and 43 surrender to Sullivan County duly executed by the registered owner of the registered owner's duly 44 authorized attorney. Upon the transfer of any such Note, Sullivan County shall issue in the name of 45 the transferee a new registered note or notes of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity 46 as the surrendered Notes. Sullivan County shall not be obligated to make any such Note transfer 47 during the fifteen (15) days next preceding an interest payment date of the Notes or, in the case of 48 any redemption of the Notes, during the forty-five (45) days next preceding the date of redemption. 49

50 51 Section 7. That, the Notes shall be in substantially the form attached hereto and shall recite 52 that the Notes are issued pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated.

Section 8. That the Notes shall be sold only after the receipt of the written approval of the State of Local Finance for the sale of the Notes.

Section 9. That, the notes are hereby designated as qualified tax-exempt obligations for purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

Section 10. That, after the sale of the Notes, and for each year that any of the notes are outstanding, Sullivan County shall prepare an annual budget in a form consistent with accepted governmental standards and as approved by the State Director of Local Finance (the "Director".) The budget shall be kept balanced during the life of the notes. The annual budget shall be submitted to the Director immediately upon its adoption; however, it shall not become the official budget for the fiscal year until such budget is approved by the Director in accordance with Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Statutes"). If the Director determines that the budget does not comply with the Statutes, Sullivan County shall adjust its estimates or make additional tax levies sufficient to comply with the Statutes, or as directed by the Director.

Section 11. That, if any of the Notes shall remain unpaid at the end of two (2) years from the issue date, then the unpaid Notes shall be renewed or extended as permitted by law, or retired from the funds of Sullivan County or be converted into bonds pursuant to Chapter 11 of Title 9 of Tennessee Code Annotated, or any other law, or be otherwise liquidated as approval by the State Director of Local Finance.

Section 12. That, all orders or resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed insofar as such conflict exists and this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

Section 13. The account codes for these funding projects to be assigned by the Director of Accounts and Budgets.
