RESOLUTION Authorizing Archives And Records Management Fee As Established In Accordance With Tennessee Code Annotated §10-7-408

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated §10-7-408 permits counties to enact an archives and record management fee to fund county archives, and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Department of Archives and Tourism is in need of funding for records space, and personnel for managing, scanning, and accessing its archival records, and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Public Records Commission unanimously recommends the creation of an archives and record management fee for Sullivan County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED By The Board Of County Commissioners Of Sullivan, Tennessee That:

SECTION 1. In accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated §10-7-408, which authorizes counties to establish an archives and record management fee, the county legislative hereby creates an archives and record management fee in accordance with the following schedule:

A) Courts of General Sessions, Circuit, Criminal, Probate, and Chancery:
A fee of \$5.00 for all public records filed with the clerks of court for the purpose of initiating a legal proceeding.

B) County Clerk:
A fee of \$5.00 for all marriage license applications
A fee of \$5.00 for all beer permit applications
A fee of \$5.00 for all notary public applications
A fee of \$5.00 for all vehicle titles, to include replacement titles
A fee of \$5.00 for all business license applications

C) Zoning Department:
A fee of \$5.00 for all building permit applications
A fee of \$5.00 for all rezoning requests
A fee of \$5.00 for all variance applications
A fee of \$5.00 for all stormwater permits

D) Highway Department:
A fee of \$5.00 for all driveway permits
A fee of \$5.00 for all road cut permits

SECTION 2. Funds collected through this fee are designated exclusively for duplicating, storing, and maintaining any records required by law to be kept.

SECTION 3. For purposes of collection, this Resolution shall take effect on the first day of May, 2014.

2010 Tennessee Code

10-7-408. Appropriation of funds Filing fees.

(a) The county legislative body of any county which creates a county records commission has the power to appropriate such funds as may be required for the carrying out of the purposes of this chapter including, but not limited to, the purchase or leasing of equipment, the equipping of an office and the payment of the expenses thereof, the furnishing of secretaries and clerical help and the employment of expert advice and assistance.

(b) In any county, if the county legislative body creates a county records commission, then the county legislative body is authorized to:

(1) Appropriate such funds as may be required for carrying out of the purposes of this chapter, including, but not limited to, the purchase or leasing of equipment, the equipping of an office and the payment of the expenses of the office, the furnishing of secretaries and clerical help, and the employment of expert advice and assistance; and

(2) Establish and collect, through all entities creating public records, as defined in § 10-7-403, an archives and record management fee not to exceed five dollars (\$5.00) per document filed. Funds collected through this fee must be designated exclusively for duplicating, storing, and maintaining any records required by law to be permanently kept.

RESOLUTION To Amend The General Fund Appropriations For Self Insurance Risk Management.

WHEREAS, during the 2013-14 FY budget process, inadequate information was available to properly fund the Self Insurance Risk Management services for Sullivan County; and

WHEREAS, the 2013-14 FY appropriations includes \$600,000 for the Self Insurance Risk Management services, however, these funds will not be sufficient to meet the requirements for the current fiscal year. Self Insurance Risk Management expenditures were \$1,027,732 for 2013; \$1,293,760 for 2012; \$1,060,248 for 2011; and, \$1,339,512 for 2010.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session, hereby authorize amendments to the appropriations in the amount of \$400,000 for the remainder of the fiscal year with the funding to come from the General Fund's Fund Balance. (Account codes to be assigned by the Director of Accounts and Budgets).

RESOLUTION Approving The Acceptance Of Right-Of-Way From Josh And Jim Baskett And The Improvements To Ridgeway Road

WHEREAS, Victory Sports Racing and Muddy Creek Raceway, located in Blountville, TN, have been doing motocross events since the late 1970's; and

WHEREAS, Muddy Creek Raceway hosts 7 to 8 events each year which brings motorcycle riders to Sullivan County from a minimum of eight states; and

WHEREAS, beginning in 2013, Muddy Creek Raceway began hosting a PRO NATIONAL event, which is the only PRO NATIONAL even in the Southeast; and

WHEREAS, the 2013 PRO NATIONAL event brought in riders from thirty-five (35) states and Canada, and approximately 20,000 people; and

WHEREAS, the PRO NATIONAL event is coming back to Muddy Creek Raceway in 2014, 2015, 2016, and in 2017, and it is the desire of Muddy Creek Raceway to keep the PRO NATIONAL event coming to Sullivan County for many more years; and

WHEREAS, NBC will broadcast the PRO NATIONAL event this year; and

WHEREAS, it is expected that the 2014 PRO NATIONAL event will bring in revenue to the local economy in excess of one million dollars (\$1,000,000); and

WHEREAS, approximately 50 to 60 tractor & trailer trucks, semis, will be coming to Muddy Creek Raceway as a part of the PRO NATIONAL event; and

WHEREAS, last year during the PRO NATIONAL event tractor trailers trucks had a hard time negotiating Ridgeway Drive because of its narrowness thereby causing traffic problems; and

The Victims Assistance Fund

The Children's Advocacy Center of Sullivan County (CAC) has been providing services to victims of child sexual abuse and/or severe physical abuse for more than 20 years. The need for the services provided by the CAC is reflected in the increased number of allegations of abuse referred to the CAC. There were 872 referrals of sexual and physical abuse in 2012. That number increased to 1131 in 2013. The CAC recognizes that victims of child abuse and their families have immediate needs as a result of their trauma. It is, therefore, the mission of the CAC to combat child sexual abuse and severe physical abuse by coordinating and providing services to children and their families in crisis in a safe, caring environment.

The fees collected from the "Victims Assistance Fee" established by the Sullivan County Commission on June 16, 2008 and in accordance to TCA §40-24-109 enables the Children's Advocacy Center to continue to provide services at no cost to the victims of child sexual and severe physical abuse. The CAC provided the following services:

Forensic Interviewing: When an allegation of child sexual or severe physical abuse is reported a forensic interview is scheduled. A forensic interview is a fact finding interview that is completed with the child victim by a specially trained forensic interviewer. The interview is conducted in a developmentally sensitive, unbiased, and truth seeking manner that will support accurate and fair decision making in the criminal justice and child welfare system. Through a series of non-leading questions, the interviewer gently assesses the child's communication skills so the interview is conducted at a level that is consistent with the child's developmental abilities. The CAC conducted 317 forensic interviews in 2012 and 364 in 2013.

Victim's Services Program - Assistance to non-offending caregivers is provided through the center's Victim's Service Program. Non-offending caregivers are assisted with locating resources, understanding the legal system, understanding their child's needs, and managing their own feelings resulting from the abuse. The Victim's Services Coordinator (VSC) serves as an ongoing resource for the non-offending caregivers of the child victim. The VSC serves as a liaison to law enforcement and the prosecutor's office. The VSC is also responsible for data collection and tracking information. The VSC assisted 377 families in 2012 and 380 in 2013.

Family Advocacy - The Family Advocate (FA) is the primary individual trained to assist the non-offending caregiver in understanding the legal and child protection systems, assistance with resources such as housing, transportation, educational and medical needs as well as financial assistance. The FA offers a Caregiver Support Group that is scheduled concurrently with the child victim sessions. In addition, the FA provides transportation to victims and non-offending caregivers as needed in order to ensure services are accessible. The FA served 332 non-offending caregivers in 2012 and 280 in 2013.

Clinical Program - The Clinical Program consists of Trauma Focused -Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT), which provides child victims and caregivers' practical skills and knowledge in areas such as psycho education, relaxation skills, behavior management skills, personal safety skills, and correcting unhelpful thoughts in order to better manage feelings. Caregiver involvement is an integral part of the TF-CBT. The child's need for emotional, support and coping skills are addressed through individual and/or group therapy. This focused treatment is essential as the long-term effects of untreated child abuse are serious for both the victim and for society. Treatment for the abused child and his/her family can help to break the cycle of abuse and dramatically reduce long-term emotional, medical, and behavioral problems. Hope can replace fear and shame. Childhood can be reclaimed. In 2012, there were 85 children that received TF-CBT and in 2013 there were 70 children that received TF-CBT.




