## ORDER APPOINTING INTERIM COMMISSIONER

Commissioner Ira Stewart was elected to his current term on the Board of Commissioners of Blountville Utility District of Sullivan County, Tennessee (the District) by the election of the District's customers at an election meeting on October 12, 2000. The District's Board of Commissioners and the undersigned County Mayor have recently learned that vacancies on the District's Board of Commissioners are to be filled by appointment by the County Mayor after the certification of three nominees to the County Mayor by the District's Board of Commissioners in accordance with T.C.A. § 7-82-307(a).

Pursuant to T.C.A. § 7-82-307(d), the County Mayor has the power and responsibility to make an interim appointment to a utility district's board of commissioners when a utility district's board of commissioners has failed to undertake the necessary actions for the appointment or election of a commissioner to fill a vacancy on a utility district's board of commissioners. The vacancy on the District's Board filled by the election of Mr. Stewart was not the correct procedure prescribed by T.C.A. § 7-82-307 for the filling of vacancies on the District's Board. Therefore, the District's Board has not undertaken the necessary actions prescribed by T.C.A. § 7-82-307 to have Mr. Stewart appointed to the District's Board of Commissioners.

It Is Therefore Ordered, Adjudged and Decreed, that Ira Stewart is hereby appointed to the Board of Commissioners of Blountville Utility District of Sullivan County, Tennessee as an interim commissioner in accordance with the provisions of T.C.A. § 7-82-307(d). Mr. Stewart shall serve as an interim commissioner until the District's Board of Commissioners certifies a list of three nominees to the County Mayor for appointment to the Board, the County

Mayor makes an appointment and such appointee is qualified to serve as prescribed by T.C.A. § 7-82-307(a)

Adding more homes to this dead end road would create a BKGGER water pressure problem.

#### Lhope that you will consider my request to NOT approve this response.





WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2 passed November 20, 2000, the Sullivan County legislative body delegated the duties and powers to regulate ambulance service in Sullivan County as set forth in Tennessee Code Annotated §7-61-101, et seq. to the Sullivan County Administrative Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Administrative Committee has voted to eliminate the pre-existing method of granting permits to various ambulance service providers and has in place thereof voted to grant an exclusive franchise to the Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service with the understanding that Sullivan County may contract with other ambulance service providers to assist Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service if need be; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Administrative Committee has adopted an application form and a set of rules and regulations to be used in regulating ambulance service providers wishing to contract with Sullivan County for the provision of ambulance service as needed to assist the Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County legislative body has been asked to approve and show its support for these changes in the way ambulance service in Sullivan County is provided and regulated;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session, hereby affirms its delegation of the duties and powers to regulate ambulance service in Sullivan County as set forth in <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> §7-61-101, et seq. to the Sullivan County Administrative Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sullivan County legislative body hereby approves the granting of an exclusive franchise to provide ambulance service in Sullivan County to the Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service with the understanding that Sullivan County may contract with other ambulance service providers to assist the Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service as needed, said franchise to be effective January 1, 2005.

# REGULATIONS OF PRE-HOSPITAL CARE IN SULLIVAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE

**PREPARED BY:** ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE, SULLIVAN COUNTY COMMISSION

APPROVED BY: SULLIVAN COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE, SULLIVAN COUNTY COMMISSION

Regulations contained within are in no way intended to discriminate against any private or non-profit Ambulance services. These Regulations are established to ensure the highest level of pre-hospital care and welfare to all sick or injured citizens or visitors of Kingsport, Bristol, Bluff City and Sullivan County. ANY ELIGIBLE SERVICE THAT FAILS TO COMPLY OR MEET THESE STANDARDS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CONTRACT WITH SULLIVAN COUNTY FOR THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY AND/OR NON-EMERGENCY AMBULANCE SERVICES IN SULLIVAN COUNTY.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> §7-61-103, the governing body of any county may adopt and enforce reasonable regulations for the protection of the public welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Administrative Committee heretofore approved in April, 2004 an exclusive franchise to the Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service to provide emergency and non-emergency medical services within Sullivan County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, it may be necessary for Sullivan County to contract with other ambulance services to assist Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service with emergency and/or non-emergency ambulance service; and

WHEREAS, the following regulations have been established setting forth guidelines which shall be followed for an ambulance service to be eligible to contract with Sullivan County.

NOW THEREFORE, be it regulated by the Administrative Committee of Sullivan County as follows:

## SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

A. Advanced Life Support (ALS) – treatment of life-threatening medical emergencies by authorized Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedics under medical control, pursuant to the rules of the department, or the provision of such treatment by other qualified and licensed medical or nursing personnel.

- **B.** Advisory Committee Subcommittee appointed by the Committee to advise on pre-hospital care issues.
- C. Ambulance Anything by means of which a patient is transported by a Service Provider.
- D. Basic Life Support (BLS) treatment of life-threatening medical emergencies by an Emergency Medical Technician or other qualified and licensed medical and nursing personnel qualified through the use of such techniques as patient assessment basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation, splinting, obstetrical assistance, bandaging, administration of oxygen, application of pneumatic antishock trousers, and other techniques described in the basic Emergency Medical Technician curriculum or otherwise approved by the Tennessee State E.M.S. Board, pursuant to the rules of the Department.

#### E. Classifications of Ambulance Services:

- 1) Class A Advanced Life Support ambulance services shall conduct operations of Ambulances to provide capabilities for advanced life support for special critical care on ninety-five percent (95%) of emergency runs within their service area staffed to provide twenty-four hour service. All Ambulances shall be equipped at a minimum as a basic life support unit. Staffed Ambulances shall be equipped to provide advanced life support.
- 2) Class B Extended Life Support ambulance services shall conduct operations of Ambulances to provide capabilities for extended life support on ninety-five percent (95%) of emergency runs within their service area, staffed to provide twenty-four hour service. All Ambulances shall be equipped as a minimum as a basic life support unit.
- 3) Class C Basic Life Support ambulance services shall conduct operations of Ambulances to provide capabilities for basic life support on ninety-five percent (95%) of emergency runs within their service area, staffed to provide twenty-four hour service. All Ambulances shall be equipped as a minimum as a basic life support unit.
- 4) Class D Minimum standard ambulance services shall conduct operations in compliance with minimum standards for Ambulance services, staffed to provide twenty-four hour service. All Ambulances shall be equipped as a minimum as a basic life support unit.

- 5) Special Ambulance Services shall conduct operations only upon a preplanned schedule or as a secondary resource when services classified under I through 4, as designated above, are unable to provide service; but shall otherwise comply with all minimum standards as set forth in statute or rule. All Ambulances shall be equipped as a minimum as a basic life support unit.
- 6) Air Ambulance Services shall constitute a separate class of service for operation under standards established in Rule 1200-12-1-.05.
- F. Committee Sullivan County Commission Administrative Committee.
- G. Contract Written agreement between a Service Provider and Sullivan County, Tennessee for the purpose of assisting Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service by providing limited emergency and/or non-emergency ambulance services in Sullivan County.
- H. Convalescent Transport Transport of any patient not requiring Emergency Transport.
- I. Coordinator Director of the Sullivan County Emergency Management Agency or designee that is approved by the Committee.
- J. Sullivan County Sullivan County, Tennessee to include Kingsport, Bristol, and Bluff City.
- K. Department The Tennessee Department of Health, Division of Emergency Medical Services.
- L. **Dispatch Center** Any dispatch entity that receives or dispatches Ambulance calls.
- M. E. M. T. Any person licensed by the Department as an Emergency Medical Technician.
- N. Emergency Transport Transport of any patient with signs or symptoms suggestive of an immediate life-threatening condition.
- O. First Responder A person who has completed required training and who participates in an organized program of mobile pre-hospital emergency medical care.

- P. Medical Director A physician licensed to practice in the State of Tennessee, contracted by a Service Provider to provide medical supervision and assure the provision of quality emergency medical care by agents of the Service Provider.
- Q. Paramedic Any person licensed by the Department as an EMT-P.
- **R.** Patient Any person suffering from any illness or injury.
- S. Primary Service Provider Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service.
- T. Service Any sole proprietor, firm, association, partnership, corporation or other legal entity.
- U. Service Provider Any Service selected by Sullivan County and under contract with Sullivan County to assist Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service in providing limited emergency and/or non-emergency ambulance services within Sullivan County.

## SECTION 2. CONTRACT REQUIRED

A. No service shall provide ambulance service, whether emergency, non-emergency, or convalescent, in Sullivan County without a Contract. No Service shall be eligible to enter into a Contract with Sullivan County to provide emergency, non-emergency, or convalescent ambulance service within Sullivan County unless and until such Service has met all qualifications set forth in these regulations and has been approved by the Committee.

The EMA Director or designee may waive the requirements of a Contract on an emergency basis upon determining that a public health emergency exists which necessitates a Service being allowed to act as a Service Provider until the abatement of the public health emergency as determined by the EMA Director or designee.

B. Any Service desiring to be considered for a Contract with Sullivan County shall submit application to the Committee on the form provided by the Committee pursuant to time deadlines to be established by the Committee. The Committee is thereafter to be notified by the applicant within thirty (30) days of any change in the information supplied on their application. All applications shall be postmarked or delivered to Sullivan County EMA Office, P. O. Box 389(mailing), 3193 Highway 126, Blountville, Tennessee 37617.

- C. The Coordinator shall present to the Committee all applications filed for consideration.
- D. The Committee shall give application(s) to the Advisory Committee to review, validate and/or determine whether or not each applicant meets the requirements of these Regulations. In the event an applicant does not meet the requirements of these Regulations, the Advisory Committee shall identify requirements that are not met. The Advisory Committee shall provide its findings to the Committee for their approval. The Committee shall forward applicants approved by the Committee to the Sullivan County Purchasing Agent. The Sullivan County Purchasing Agent shall prepare and send out bid packages to all qualified bidders. When the bids are received by the Purchasing Agent, the Purchasing Agent may consult with the Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service and the Advisory Committee to review the bids and seek input with regards to awarding contracts.
- E. Temporary Contracts, not to exceed sixty (60) days, may be recommended at any time at the discretion of the Committee.
- F. Air Ambulance services are exempt from Contract requirements.

## SECTION 3. OPERATING REQUIREMENTS

- A. All Service Providers shall at all times conform to the following requirements:
  - 1. All Rules and Regulations of the Department;
  - 2. All Rules and Regulations of the Committee including these Regulations.

#### B. BASE OF OPERATIONS:

1. Each Service Provider shall maintain a fixed base of operation in Sullivan County which houses necessary equipment and personnel for business functions, and shall maintain twenty-four hours a day communication capability with the public (telephone) and with all of their vehicles (radio) used to provide emergency response or patient transportation.

- 2. Each Service Provider operating in Sullivan County must provide for a local business office in Sullivan County open to the public during reasonable normal business hours for the purpose of paying bills, acceptance of complaints and conducting business with the Service Provider. The address and phone number of the local Sullivan County office shall appear in any advertising, billing information or Service Provider brochure distributed or addressed for delivery in Sullivan County.
- 3. Vehicles used for provision of Emergency Transport in Sullivan County or for transporting patients from point to point in Sullivan County shall be stationed in Sullivan County. Each Service Provider is required to maintain a current list of all locations used by the Service Provider to station such vehicles and the hours when such locations are to be used and fully staffed.
- 4. Air-Medical Services are exempt from the requirements of this Section 3(B).

## C. VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT

- 1. All maintenance and repair records and inventory records, including medicine and drugs, shall be available for the inspection by the Coordinator or Committee.
- 2. Each Ambulance used for any Emergency Transport of Patients must be equipped for radio communication with all 911 Dispatch Centers and hospitals in Sullivan County.
- 3. Service Provider shall have all necessary equipment for use in inclement weather.
- 4. Each Ambulance shall display the Service Provider's name and Ambulance identification number on both exterior sides of the vehicle's body with a minimum size three (3) inch block letters. Letters should contrast with the primary body color of the vehicle and should be easily readable from a distance of one hundred (100) feet.
- 5. No Service Provider operating in Sullivan County shall use or advertise the words "Sullivan County" as a part of its trade or business name without the permission of the Committee.

- 6. All Service Providers shall prominently display on all Ambulances "EMERGENCY DIAL 911". No other telephone number will be displayed.
- 7. No Service Provider shall display or advertise a seven (7) or ten (10) digit telephone number for emergency calls for service. All Service Providers shall include the "911" number for emergency calls in any advertising and shall not represent that another telephone number other than "911" should be used to request an emergency Ambulance. Any advertising or document, letterhead, business card, brochures distributed or generated by the Service Provider that includes the seven (7) or ten (10) digit telephone number should also include a statement or reference that "911" should be used to call for emergency medical care.

## D. EMERGENCY TRANSPORTS AND RESPONSES

- 1. All Service Providers are required in cases of disaster or emergency drill preparedness to respond to the request of any 911 center in Sullivan County and report for response coordination by the Tennessee EMS Consultant, EMA Director or his designee.
- 2. All Service Providers shall establish mutual aid agreements with Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service.
- Any Service Provider that intends to provide Emergency Transport in Sullivan County shall be licensed as a Class A service and shall comply with all Class A standards as defined by the Department. All Ambulances shall be equipped as an ALS Ambulance and must be staffed with a minimum crew consisting of a Paramedic and EMT.
  - Any other Service Provider shall be licensed as a Class A service. All Ambulances shall be equipped at a minimum as BLS Ambulance with the addition of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and must be staffed with a minimum crew consisting of two (2) EMTs.
- Only Sullivan County Emergency Medical Service will provide Emergency Transport in Sullivan County unless a Service Provider is requested to do so by any 911 Dispatch Center in Sullivan County. Emergency Provider in the event of deterioration in the condition of a Patient being transported by the provider, or in the event the condition of a

of the Patient worsened prior to the arrival of the non-emergency provider and upon assessment the Patient is felt to require immediate Emergency Transport to a medical facility. Additionally, a Service Provider may provide emergency interhospital transport if the Ambulance used is equipped as an ALS Ambulance and staffed with a minimum crew of a Paramedic and EMT.

- 5. Should any Service Provider receive a call requesting Emergency Transport or emergency service of any kind, the Service Provider shall, if appropriate under the facts given, immediately advise caller to CALL 911. If caller is unable or unwilling to do so, the Service Provider will obtain all pertinent information from the caller, attempt to keep the caller on line, and immediately call the 911 Dispatch Center and relay the information to the center for provision of emergency response. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS REGULATION MAY RESULT IN IMMEDIATE TERMINATION OF CONTRACT.
- 6. No Service Provider shall cause or permit any Ambulance to be dispatched on the basis of information received and obtained by monitoring a radio frequency assigned to law enforcement, Ambulance service, rescue squad, fire department or other governmental or public agency, except pursuant to specific request and prior arrangement with the coordinating agency responsible for dispatching emergency Ambulances.

## SECTION 4. COMMUNICATIONS

- A. All Service Providers shall meet the radio requirements of the Department.
- B. Any Service Provider responding on emergency traffic in Sullivan County will coordinate all radio communications through appropriate 911 Dispatch Center and the Dispatch Center responsible for the call on appropriate EMS channel.
- C. Each Service Provider will insure all of its personnel are familiar with communication procedures used by 911 Dispatch Center.
- D. In the event of vehicle or equipment failure while providing Emergency Transport, the appropriate 911 Dispatch Center shall be notified immediately to dispatch appropriate back-up Service Provider.

E. Phone lines that receive request for an emergency Ambulance response, and radio frequency that dispatch emergency traffic shall be recorded. Those recordings shall be maintained for a period of at least one (1) year.

#### SECTION 5. PERSONNEL

- A. All personnel shall be physically capable of performing the tasks assigned by the Service Provider, shall be clean in dress and person and shall display their name, certification, and Service Provider name in an appropriate manner visible to the Patient.
- B. All Service Providers will schedule personnel in a manner to ensure adequate rest.
- C. Each Service Provider shall have a Medical Director licensed to practice in the State of Tennessee and currently practicing Emergency Medicine in Sullivan County.

#### SECTION 6. ADDITIONAL COMPLIANCE

- A. In addition to the rules and regulations set forth herein, all Service Providers shall comply with all federal, state and local laws and regulations. Wherein these Regulations of Pre-Hospital Care in Sullivan County, Tennessee are intended to conform to state and federal law, rules and regulations, they shall automatically, without further action required, be amended to reflect change to said state and federal laws, rules and regulations.
- B. No Service Provider shall operate in Sullivan County without a valid Tennessee EMS license. If during the year of operation the status of the Service Provider's Tennessee license changes (e.g., level change, probation, conditional, etc.), the Service Provider is to notify the Coordinator or Committee Chairman immediately. <u>FAILURE TO DO SO COULD CAUSE IMMEDIATE CONTRACT REVOCATION</u>.

#### **SECTION 7. ENFORCEMENT**

#### A. Open Records

All vehicles, equipment and response reports (excluding HIPAA Policy issues) shall be available at all times for inspection by the Coordinator or the Committee's designee.

#### B. Complaints

- 1. All complaints of violation of these Regulations of Pre-Hospital Care in Sullivan County, Tennessee may be made either to the Sullivan County Purchasing Agent, the Coordinator or to the Committee with said complaint to be in writing and containing the following information:
  - a. Date and approximate time of violation.
  - b. Name of Service Provider alleged to have violated the Regulations of Pre-Hospital Care in Sullivan County, Tennessee.
  - c. Names of any and all witnesses to violations.
  - d. Facts giving rise to the violation.
- 2. If the Sullivan County Purchasing Agent, the Coordinator or any member of the Committee receives a complaint of a violation of these Regulations of Pre-Hospital Care in Sullivan County, Tennessee, it is to be brought to the Committee for consideration.
- 3. The complaint shall be forwarded to the Advisory Committee who will decide if it warrants an investigation. If it does, the Advisory Committee will request the Coordinator, his designee, or the Committee's designee to investigate the complaint and bring the results back to the Sullivan County Purchasing Agent.

#### SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY

If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of these Regulations of Pre-Hospital Care in Sullivan County, Tennessee is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions hereof.

# **RESOLUTION To Amend Health Department Budget For Unexpended Grant Funds for Dental Clinic**

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WHEREAS, funding was approved for the Sullivan County Health Department's Dental Clinic in the amount of \$300,000 during the 2003-2004 FY, (Resolution No.2003-12-128 approved on January 20, 2004) of which a balance of \$18,389.54 remained unexpended as of June 30, 2004; and,

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WHEREAS, the balance of these funds needs to be added back to the 2004-2005 FY budget to cover the final cost of the dental clinic; and,

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WHEREAS, the grant fund totaling \$300,000 have already been received from the State of Tennessee in the prior fiscal year; and,

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WHEREAS, no local funds are required to match these funds.

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Section 2. That, the Notes shall mature not later than three (3) years after the date of issuance and that the Notes and any extension or renewal notes shall not exceed the reasonably expected economic life of the Project, which is hereby certified by the Governing Body to be at least 5 years. Provided however, that each year the Notes are outstanding, one-fourth (1/4), of the original principal amount of the Notes shall mature without renewal but subject to prior redemption.

Section 3. That, the Notes shall be subject to redemption at the option of Sullivan County in whole or in part, at any time, at the principal amount and accrued interest to the date of redemption.

Section 4. That, the Notes shall be direct general obligations of Sullivan county for which the punctual payment of the principal and interest on the notes, the full faith and credit of Sullivan County is irrevocably pledged and Sullivan County hereby pledges its taxing power as to all taxable property in Sullivan County for purpose of providing funds for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes. The governing body of Sullivan County hereby authorizes the levy and collection of a special tax on all taxable property of Sullivan County over and above all other taxes authorized by Sullivan County to create a sinking fund to retire the Notes with interest as they mature in an amount necessary for that purpose. If applicable, the Notes shall be further secured by revenues generated by E.M.S. collections.

Section 5. That, the Notes shall be executed in the name of Sullivan County and bear the manual signature of the County Mayor of Sullivan County and the manual signature of the County Clerk with the local government seal affixed thereon; and shall be payable as to principal and interest at the Sullivan County Office of Accounts and Budgets or the paying agent duly appointed by Sullivan County. Proceeds of the Notes shall be deposited with the banking institution of Sullivan County and shall be paid out for the purpose of financing the Project pursuant to this Resolution and as required by law.

Section 6. That, the Notes will be issued in fully registered form and that at all times during which any Notes remains outstanding and unpaid, Sullivan county or its agent shall keep or cause to be kept at its office a note register, if held by an agent of Sullivan County, shall at all times be open for inspection by Sullivan County or any duly authorized officer of Sullivan County. Each Note shall have the qualities and incidents of a negotiable instrument and shall be transferable only upon the note register kept by Sullivan County or its agent, by the registered owner of the Note in person or by the registered owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, upon presentation and surrender to Sullivan County duly executed by the registered owner of the registered owner's duly authorized attorney.

Upon the transfer of any such Note, Sullivan County shall issue in the name of the transferee a new registered note or notes of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity as the surrendered Notes. Sullivan County shall not be obligated to make any such Note transfer during the fifteen (15) days next preceding an interest payment date of the Notes or, in the case of any redemption of the Notes, during the forty-five (45) days next preceding the date of redemption.

That, the Notes shall be in substantially the form attached hereto and shall Section 7. recite that the Notes are issued pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated.

That, the Notes shall be sold only after the receipt of the written approval of Section 8. the State of Local Finance for the sale of the Notes.

That, the notes are hereby designated as qualified tax-exempt obligations for Section 9. purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

That, after the sale of the Notes, and for each year that any of the notes are outstanding, Sullivan County shall prepare an annual budget in a form consistent with accepted governmental standards and as approved by the State Director of Local Finance (the "Director".) The budget shall be kept balanced during the life of the notes. The annual budget shall be submitted to the Director immediately upon its adoption; however, it shall not become the official budget for the fiscal year until such budget is approve by the Director in accordance with Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Statutes"). If the Director determines that the budget does not comply with the Statutes, Sullivan County shall adjust its estimates or make additional tax levies sufficient to comply with the Statutes, or as directed by the Director.

That, if any of the Notes shall remain unpaid at the end of three (3) years from the issue date, then the unpaid Notes shall be renewed or extended as permitted by law, or retired from the funds of Sullivan County or be converted into bonds pursuant to Chapter 11 of Title 9 of Tennessee Code Annotated, or any other law, or be otherwise liquidated as approval by the State Director of Local Finance.



#### **AGREEMENT**

This Agreement to be effective as of 21 day of June, 2000, by and between the CITY OF KINGSPORT, TENNESSEE, a Tennessee municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "City"); and SULLIVAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee (hereinafter referred to as the "County").

#### WITNESSETH:

For and in consideration of the adoption of the Growth Plan for Sullivan County, as recommended by the Sullivan County Coordinating Committee on May 19, 2000 pursuant to Chapter 1101 of the Tennessee Public Acts of 1998, and in accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated §6-58-104(a)(6), the City and the County hereby agree as follows:

- 1. During the term of this Agreement, the City will refrain from annexing by its own initiative, property used as residential property pre-existing this agreement in the area shown in green on the map entitled Kingsport Annexation Agreement Map, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference and more particularly described as that area located within Sullivan County voting precincts 14 Colonial Heights and 14 Miller Perry (as of the date of this Agreement) and being east of Interstate Highway 181 (hereinafter referred to as "Agreed Area").
- 2. The County agrees that annexation of any property not used as residential property in the Agreed Area pre-existing this agreement may at the initiative of the City by ordinance be annexed even without a petition by the property owner.
- 3. This Agreement shall become effective immediately upon the ratification by all five (5) governing bodies of the revised Sullivan County Growth Plan, which was recommended by the Sullivan County Coordinating Committee on May 19, 2000, and this Agreement shall continue in effect for an initial term of five (5) years. The parties agree that the date stated at the beginning of this Agreement is the date on which the term of the Agreement commenced.
- 4. This Agreement shall become null and void if: (a) the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee should fail to approve the Growth Plan for Sullivan County; or (b) a court of competent jurisdiction should determine that the Growth Plan for Sullivan County or any portion thereof dealing with the Agreed Area is invalid or illegal; or (c) the revised Growth Plan for Sullivan County should for any reason fail to become operative, or should cease to remain operative at any time during the term of this Agreement.
- 5. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as limiting or otherwise affecting the authority of the City to annex territory in the Agreed Area by referendum in accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated §6-51-104. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as limiting or otherwise affecting the authority of the City to annex in any way permitted by law in any territory not included in the Agreed Area. This agreement

shall not include any new residential developments and or pre-existing or new commercial or industrial developments.

- 6. Annually upon the anniversary of the commencement of this Agreement, the parties hereto agree to extend the term of this Agreement one year such that upon each annual anniversary this Agreement will have a new full five (5) year term. It is the intent of the parties hereto that this Agreement shall limit annexation as set forth herein for the time period up to and including January 1, 2010; however, notwithstanding anything to the contrary, the parties agree the intent of the parties is that this Agreement shall in no way be extended beyond January 1, 2010.
- 7. Each party represents that its governing body has duly approved this Agreement, and the undersigned is authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of the respective parties.
