

Whereas, David Ward Tipton was a native of Sullivan County Tennessee, born on July 2, 1924. He attended Poplar Ridge and Mary Hughes Schools; and

Whereas, David Ward Tipton was a very patriotic man, entering the U.S. Navy at age 15. He served in World War II and received campaign medals for his participation in the Atlantic Campaign, the Pacific Campaign and the occupation of Japan. Mr. Tipton served in the Navy for 20 years, retiring in 1960; and

Whereas, David Ward Tipton was a lifetime member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 9629 in Bluff City serving as post commander beginning in 1970. He served as state commander of the Tennessee VFW in 1986 and 1987. For several years he was the VFW's representative to the Board of Directors of the Mountain Home Veterans Hospital in Johnson City, Tennessee. Mr. Tipton was a lifetime member of the Sons of Confederate Veterans Lt. Robert D. Powell Camp of Blountville. He was also a member of the American Legion and the Fleet Reserve Association, and

Whereas, David Ward Tipton was a tireless worker for the Republican Party, having served as vice president of their Sullivan County Executive Committee representing the Third Legislative District, and was a member and chairman of the ninth precinct in Piney Flats; and

Whereas, David Ward Tipton was appointed by Governor McWherter in 1988 to the Tennessee Veterans Home Board, and was reappointed by Governors Sundquist and Bredesen. He also served on the Sullivan County Board of Zoning Appeals for many years – and had retired from that duty shortly before his passing; and

Whereas, David Ward Tipton was a man of faith being a member of Poplar Ridge Christian Church in Piney Flats, Tennessee. This church had been founded by his ancestors, the Smith and Weaver families in 1842. He was a devoted family man and a gentleman who greatly loved his nation.

Now, therefore, I, Steve Godsey, Mayor of Sullivan County, and the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners, do hereby commend

David Ward Tipton

for his good citizenship and service to Sullivan County Tennessee, as we offer our condolences to his family while we mourn the passing of David Ward Tipton on December 4, 2008.

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

- Staff presented the draft text amendment for year-round/seasonal campground facilities (excluding temporary campgrounds).
- Discussion opened on the matter.
- The board listened to comments from the floor from several commercial campground owners such as Tony Childress and Donald Anderson.
- Staff read the final version as recommended from the floor:
- Amendment to Appendix D for Community/Commercial and Resort Campground Facilities permanent Accessory Structures shall be permitted as follows:
 - o Yes, no greater than 200 square feet in total area per camper site. All accessory structures, limited to decks, covered decks, screened-in covered decks, or outbuildings/yard barns and excluding any enclosed additions to campers, shall be permitted and approved by the Planning & Zoning Department. Such structures shall be illustrated on an updated site plan pursuant to Article XII regarding site plan requirements and building permit fees set by the County Commission. Existing structures shall be allowed to remain, may be replaced or removed, pursuant to Article XI regarding the legal status of non-conforming structures.

Separation Standards for Community/Commercial Campgrounds shall be revised as follows:

Yes, a ten-foot separation between all accessory structures and the next adjacent camper/RV/travel trailer shall be required. Each camping site shall be a minimum of thirty feet wide per site.

Separation Standards for Commercial Resort Developments shall be revised as follows:

- Yes, a ten-foot separation between all accessory structures and the next adjacent camper/RV/Travel trailer shall be required. Each camping site shall be a minimum of fifty feet wide per site.
- Staff distributed copies of the permit fee schedule. Members agreed to set the permit fee the same for residential accessory structures.
- Mike McIntire motioned in favor of this text amendment as finalized. Roy Settle seconded the motion and the vote in favor passed unanimously.

Staff stated she will forward to Bristol and Kingsport Planning and then on to the County Commission for final ruling.

RESOLUTION to Improve Management of Sullivan County's Increasing Funding Cost for Health Insurance Cost/Claims for Retirees

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has a significant cost annually for health insurance provided for its active employees, as well as it's retirees; and,

WHEREAS, Sullivan County, is required under GASB 45, must change accounting methods to reflect retiree health insurance liabilities on behalf of current and future retirees; and,

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has a responsibility to maintain the viability of it's health insurance program for it's current and future retirees as well as its active employees.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session require those who retire after January 1, 2013—2010, who have not satisfied the minimum of 25 years of service to pay the full cost of the applicable not make for the group and Wedness supplement covering for their Medicare Supplement health insurance coverage based upon the number of years of full time service with Sullivan County Government as follows; and,

Years of Service	Sullivan County	Retiree
25+years	100%	0%
20-24 years	75%	25%
15-19 years	50%	50%

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session require all <u>future retirees and/or covered dependents</u> to participate in any applicable disease management program provided by Sullivan County Government. Failure to reasonably participate would result in the retiree and/or dependent no longer being eligible for coverage under the retiree health insurance plan; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT retirees with 25 years of service who retire from Sullivan County and are employed elsewhere, where health insurance is offered, may elect to dis-enroll from Sullivan County's health insurance plan. The retiree may elect to re-enroll in the Sullivan County health insurance plan upon loss of the other coverage; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session change the <u>dependent eligibility</u> for future retiree health insurance benefits, to allow dependent spouses of eligible retirees to remain on the health insurance until the earlier of the dependent obtaining age 65 or the dependent becoming eligible for Medicare; and,

(Early Retirees Separated Due to Disability)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sullivan County is a member of the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System (TCRS) and as such recognizes those employees that qualify for disability benefits based upon TCRS requirements and allows them to participate in the County Health Insurance Plan based upon prior years service; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session clarify that the retiree eligible for retiree health insurance benefits due to a disability must apply and elect Medicare Parts A & B when first eligible. Failure to apply and elect Medicare Parts A & B will result in the disabled retiree no longer being eligible for continuation of health insurance under the Plan; and,

(Future Retirees - Over 65)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session change the self-insured health insurance benefits offered to those who retire after January 1, 2010, to a Medicare Advantage option that includes prescription drug coverage.
