## REZONING REQUESTS

January 16, 1989

1. File #10/88-11 - Consider a request by Paul Darnell to rezone the west side of Johnson Cemetery Road, known as Whispering Hills Subdivision, from R-1 Residential to R-2 Residential.

Paul Darnell Request, Map No. 10/88-11. Mr. Paul Darnell appeared before the planning commission requesting that a tract of land located on Johnson Cemetery Road, known as Whispering Hills Subdivision, and being a 32.94 acre tract be rezoned from R-1 Residential to R-2 Residential in order to permit a mobile home subdivision. In considering the request Mrs. Pond stated that she was of the opinion that all of the property shown on the map should not be considered for rezoning since other owners were involved with the rezoning. Staff stated that because the rezoning was from R-1 to R-2, if other property owners were being rezoned this would in no way adversely affect them. Mr. Nichols made a motion, seconded by Mr. Barger to approve the request. All voted in favor except Mrs. Pond who voted no, stating her reasons as being it was multiple ownership and other affected owners should have signed a rezoning petition.

2. File #11/88-2 - Consider a request by Albert Lay, Jr., to rezone a tract of land located on the south side of Qualls Road near Independence Drive from R-1 Residential to R-3 Residential.

Albert Lay, Jr., Request, Map No. 11/88-2. Mr. Albert Lay, Jr., who owns property on the south side of Qualls Road near Independence Drive requested that his property be rezoned from R-1 Residential to R-3 Residential in order to permit a mobile home. No one appeared in opposition to the request. Mr. Albert Lay, Jr., the applicant, spoke in favor of the rezoning. Mrs. Pond pointed out that the zoning ordinance stated that no new R-3 zones could be created with less than ten acres; therefore, Mr. Lay requested that an R-2 zone be permitted. Staff stated that there were other mobile homes in the area that since no one appeared in opposition to the rezoning, recommended that the request for R-2 be approved. Mr. Nichols made a motion, seconded by Mr. Barger to approve the request. Motion was approved unanimously.

3. File #11/88-3. Consider a request by Nell Benton to rezone a tract of land on the east side of Wright Road approximately 1000 feet east of Beeson Wells Road from R-1 Residential to R-3 Residential.

Nell Benton Request, Map No. 11/88-3. Mrs. Nell Benton, who owns property on the east side of Wil-Rho Circle, requested that her property be rezoned from R-1 Residential to R-3 Residential in order to permit the location of a mobile home. Mrs. Pond again noted that no new R-3 zones could be created with less than ten acres; therefore, Mrs. Benton requested that the property be rezoned R-3. Staff reported that there were several other mobile homes located along the street and recommended that the property be rezoned to R-2; therefore, Mr. Barger made a motion, seconded by Mr. Russin to approve the request. Motion was approved unanimously.

4. File #11/88-4 - Consider a request by Mrs. Hillis Burgess to rezone a tract of land on the north side of U. S. Highway 11-W near Bloomingdale Pike from R-1 Residential to B-4 Business.

Mrs. Hillis Burgess Request, Map No. 11-88-4. Mrs. Burgess requested that her property on the north side of U. S. 11-W near Bloomingdale Pike be rezoned from R-1 Residential to B-4 Business to permit an auto lot. Mr. Powell Foster, a resident of Sullivan County, appeared before the commission in opposition to the rezoning request, stating that he opposed strip commercial development. He further stated that the planning commission needed an overall development plan to prevent complete strip commercial development along Highway 11-W between Kingsport and Bristol. Staff stated that they were also opposed to strip commercial development but because of the volumes of traffic along 11-W that it would be the type of thing that would be difficult to prevent. Following a thorough discussion of the matter, Mr. Nichols made a motion, seconded by Mr. Guthrie to approve the rezoning. Motion carried.

5. File #11/88-5 - Consider a request by Roger D. Quillen to rezone a tract of land on the south side of U. S. Highway 11-W near Meadowbrook Lane from R-1 Residential to B-4 Business.

Roger D. Quillen Request, Map No. 11/88-5. Mr. Roger D. Quillen who owns property on the south side of U. S. Highway 11-W near Meadow Brook Lane requested his property be rezoned from R-1 Residential to B-4 Business. No one appeared in opposition to the rezoning. However, Mr. Powell Foster questioned whether they intended to build in the Reedy Creek floodplain and Mr. Quillen stated that he did not intend to do so. Mr. Quillen stated that this property had been a part of Evergreen Ledge Subdivision and the owners in the area had known since they had bought the property that the intent for the highway property was to be used for business purposes. Although staff was not opposed to the rezoning it was pointed out that several residences were located adjacent to this request. Since no one appeared in opposition to the rezoning, Mr. Barger made a motion, seconded by Mr. Nichols to approve the request. Motion was approved with Mrs. Pond voting no. Mrs. Pond stated that she opposed the rezoning because she felt that the single family integrity of the neighborhood should be preserved and that it was spot zoning.

6. File #11/88-6 - Consider a request by Ivan Glover to rezone a tract of land on the north side of County Home Road approximately 600 feet south of Massengill Hollow Road from R-1 Residential to R-2 Residential.

Ivan Glover Request, Map No. 11/88-6. Mr. Ivan Glover who owns property on the north side of County Home Road requested that his property be rezoned from R-1 Residential to R-2 Residential to permit the location of a mobile home. No one appeared in opposition to the rezoning. Staff stated that there were several mobile homes located in this general area and recommended that the request be approved. Mr. Nichols made a motion seconded by Mr. Barger to approve the request. Motion carried unanimously.

7. File #11/88-9 - Consider a request by Ann Parriss to rezone a tract of land on the east side of Idlewild Drive approximately 300 feet north of State Route 91 from R-1 Residential to R-2A Residential.

Ann Parriss Request, Map No. 11/88-9. Ms. Parriss appeared before the commission and requested that property she owned on the east side of Idlewild Drive be rezoned from R-1 Residential to R-2 Residential to permit the location of a group home. No one appeared in opposition to the rezoning. Mrs. Geraldine Steile spoke in favor of the rezoning. Staff stated that they had no opposition to the rezoning. Therefore, Mr. Russin made a motion, seconded by Mr. Nichols, to approve the request. Motion carried.

8. File #11/88-13 - Consider a request by John Mack Pierce to rezone a tract of land on the east side of Moreland Drive adjacent to the Tennessee Eastman property from R-1 Residential to M-1 Manufacturing.

John Mack Pierce Request, Map No. 11/88-13. Mr. John Mack Pierce, who owns an eight acre tract of land on Moreland Drive adjacent to property owned by Tennessee Eastman Company, appeared before the commission and requested that his property be rezoned from R-1 Residential to M-1 Manufacturing. Mr. Pierce pointed out that the property was now being used primarily for a junkyard, and once it is rezoned he intended to build metal buildings on the property for warehousing. Several residents appeared in opposition to the rezoning. Messrs. Dave Graber, Arthur Smith and Powell Foster all pointed out that they felt Moreland Drive should be kept in a residential zoning classification and that it would increase traffic and be harmful to the surrounding area. Staff pointed out that Mr. Pierce was now using the property as a junkyard, that it was a legal lawful nonconforming use, and that he could at any time within the next two years be reopened as a junkyard. Since an M-1 zoning is for light manufacturing coupled with the fact that it is presently being used for a junkyard, staff recommended approval because a light manufacturing zone would be much less objectionable than a junkyard. Mrs. Pond pointed out that Mr. Pierce would have to build or plant a buffer strip along the rear of the property to meet the conditions of an M-1 zone. Mr. Nichols made a motion, seconded by Mr. Neil, to approve the rezoning. Motion was approved unanimously.

9. File #11/88-14 - Consider a request to rezone the L. B. Franklin property on the west side of Airport Access Road at its intersection with Interstate Highway 81 from R-1 Residential to B-3 Business.

L. B. Franklin Request, Map No. 11/88-14. Mr. Gene Hartsock of the Appalachian Oil Company appeared before the commission requesting that a parcel of property located in the northeast intersection of I-81 and Airport access road be rezoned from R-1 Residential to ~~B-3~~ Business in order to construct a trunk stop. Mr. Neil noted that the surrounding uses of property would make this a logical use for a truck stop, and made a motion to approve the request, seconded by Mr. Barger. Motion carried unanimously.

10. File #11/88-15 - Consider a request by Kim C. Booker to rezone a tract of land on the south side of Ellis Road located off Memorial Drive near Blountville from R-1 Residential to R-2 Residential.

Kim C. Booker Request, Map No. 11/88-15. A request was made to rezone the above referenced property from R-1 Residential to R-2 Residential in order to permit the location of a mobile home. The property is located on the south side of Ellis Road. Mr. Bruce Carrier appeared on behalf of Mrs. Booker and stated that she lived in Westchester, VA and had requested him to act on her behalf. Staff noted that there were already several mobile homes located on this section of Ellis Road and recommended that the request be approved. Mr. Guthrie made a motion, seconded by Mr. Barger to approve the request. Motion carried unanimously.

11. File #11/88-16 - Consider a request by Mrs. Billy Baker to rezone a tract of land on the north side of State Route 75 near Muddy Creek Road from R-1 Residential to B-3 Business.

Mrs. Billy Baker Request, Map No. 11/88-16. Mrs. Baker, who owns a tract of land on the north side of State Route 75 near Muddy Creek Road, appeared before the planning commission and requested that her property be rezoned from R-1 Residential to B-3 Business. She stated that she wanted to use the property for the retail sale of ceramics. She further noted that the property was presently being used for warehousing and in the recent past, she had stored her ceramics in a building which had been located on the property for some time. Staff noted that a building was located on the property, that it was adjacent to a B-3 zone, and that it was a logical extension of an existing B-3 zone. Therefore, Mr. Barger made a motion, seconded by Mr. Neil, to approve the request. Motion passed unanimously.

12. File #11/88-19 - Consider a request by J. Robert Birdwell to rezone a tract of land on the north side of Brookfield Drive approximately 300 feet south of Fort Henry Drive from R-1 Residential to R-3A Residential.

Robert Birdwell Request, Map No. 11/88-19. Mr. Robert Birdwell, who owns a tract of land on the north side of Brookfield Drive, requested that a tract of land be rezoned from R-1 Residential to R-3A Residential in order to permit the location of Garden Court apartment complex. Staff noted that there were at least three other apartments located along the street, that there was a high bank to the north side and commercial development to the south side of this proposal and recommended that it be approved. It was also noted that it was adjacent to the R-2A zone and a B-3 zone. Mr. Barger made a motion, seconded by Mr. Nichols, to approve the request. Motion carried.

The Sullivan County Planning Commission approved all the requests being considered at their November 15, 1988 meeting.


