Staff noted that three mobile homes were located along Old Weaver Pike between Webb Bridge and Hickory Tree Road, the property is in large tracts and is sparsely developed. Staff stated that the property is located across the ridge from the river area and that a mobile home would have very little negative impact on the area.

Mr. Anderson stated that he had no definite plans for the development of this property. He presented photographs and maps of the area showing the location of existing businesses.

Three residents of the area appeared in opposition to the request. Elias Haines expressed concern for increased traffic on Bloomingdale Pike and for lowered property values in the area. Robln Phillips also expressed concerns about increased traffic.

The commission was presented several letters opposed to the request and it was noted that several phone calls had been received also in opposition.

It was noted that a similar request had been denied by the planning commission for this property at an earlier meeting.

Mr. Eldrith made a motion that the request be approved. After discussion among the commissioners Mr. Eldrith retracted his motion.

Mr. Kerney presented a request to rezone a tract of land located in the Thirteenth Civil District on the west side of Moreland Drive north of its intersection with Summerville Road from R-1 to R-3A to permit the location of condominiums.

Mr. Kerney stated that he had developed a subdivision on part of this property, however due to topography the portion of the property he is requesting to be rezoned would be more easily developed as condominiums. He stated that such condominiums would be compatible with development in the subdivision.

Eight residents appeared in opposition to the request and presented a petition asking the planning commission to deny the request. They expressed concerns for property values in the area and stated that most of the homes located in the area were on large tracts and high density development in this area would be incompatible with the existing land uses.

It was noted that terrain in the area was better suited to some form of cluster housing development and recommended that the property be rezoned to PRD (Planned Residential District).

On a motion by Eldrith seconded by Walkey the commission voted unanimously to approve the rezoning to PRD (Planned Residential District).

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in REGULAR Session on the 19th day of November 1990

THAT WHEREAS, The Bristol Office was established in 1899 during a business boom in that city. At the time, this bustling activity resulted in lawyers having to make a tortuous and time consuming trip to Blountville, and

WHEREAS, modern modes of travel now make Blountville readily accessible to all areas of Sullivan County, Bristol even more so than some other sections, and

WHEREAS, To have the one Register of Deeds Office in Blountville will mean a considerable savings for the taxpayers of Sullivan County, and in addition, place all records pertinent to the Office of the Register of Deeds in a central location.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Bristol Office of the Sullivan County Register of Deeds be closed as soon as possible during the fiscal year with all official operations and records of this office to be located henceforth at the Blountville County Seat within the Sullivan County Courthouse.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Sullivan County's State Legislative Delegation to prepare for passage of legislation which would effect a repeal of Chapter 242 of the Acts of Tennessee of 1899 which established the Register of Deeds Office in Bristol, Tennessee.

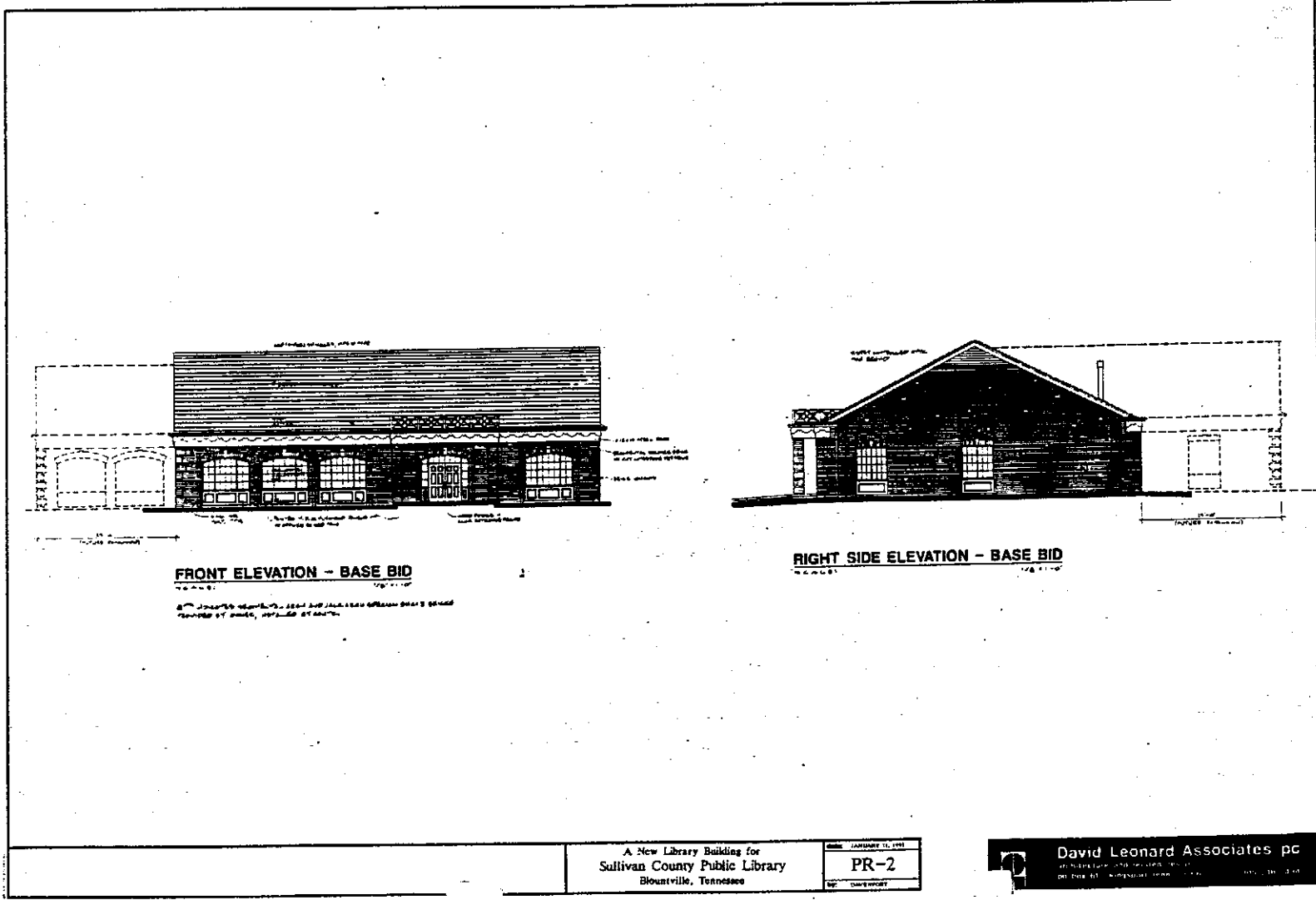

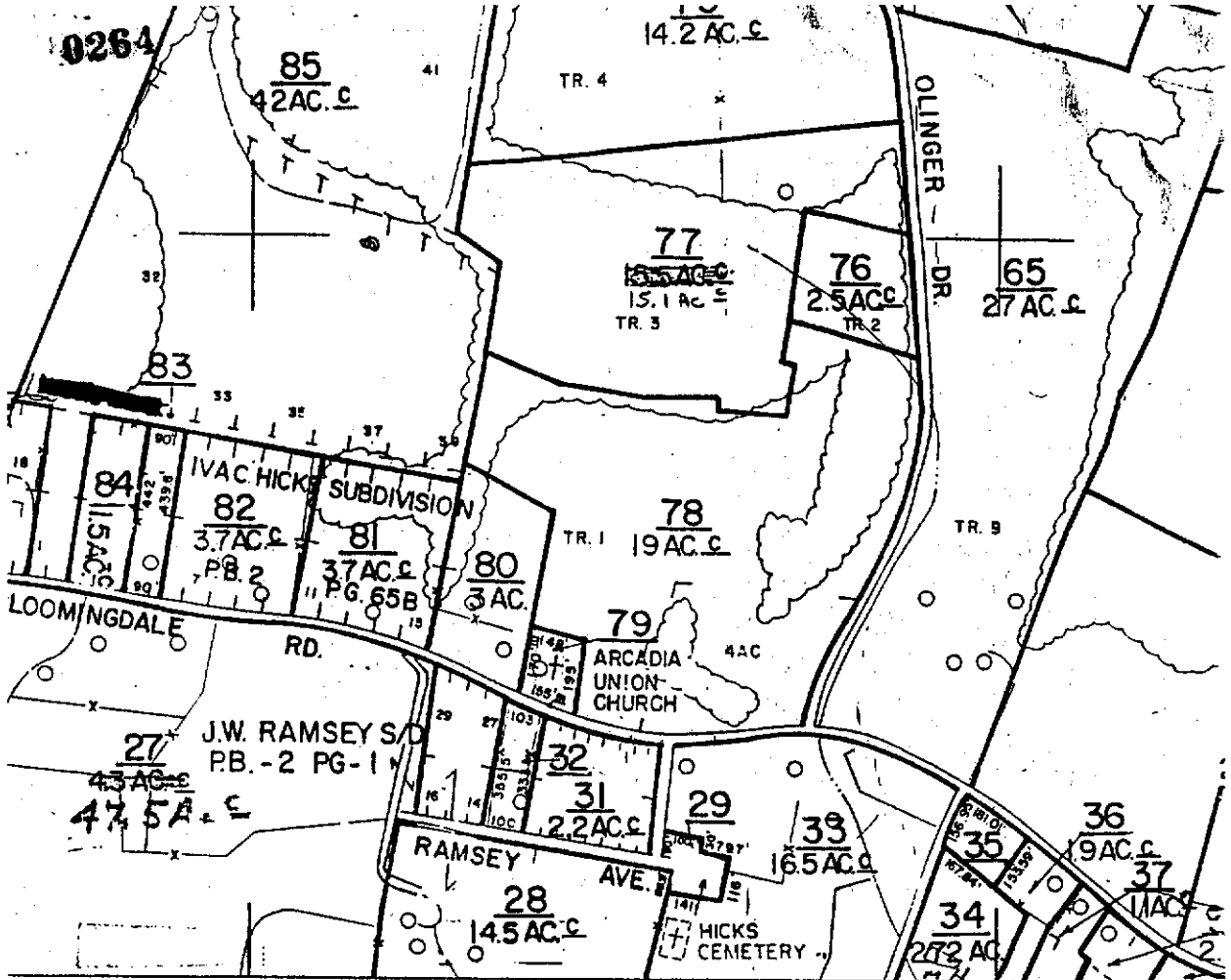
