Mr. John Mize representing the adjacent 150 year old First Baptist Church of Blountville spoke in opposition to the request and presented letters and petitions from local residents also opposing the request. Mr. Mize, chairman of the church building committee discussed plans and long range programs relating to expansion of the church property including a proposed day care center and stated that the zoning to B-2 would be detrimental to church development which needed to be protected from encroaching business. Staff stated the request would not be compatible with existing building patterns noting that B-2 designation places no restrictions on yard requirements or percentage of the lot which may be covered by a building. Staff recommended the request be denied.

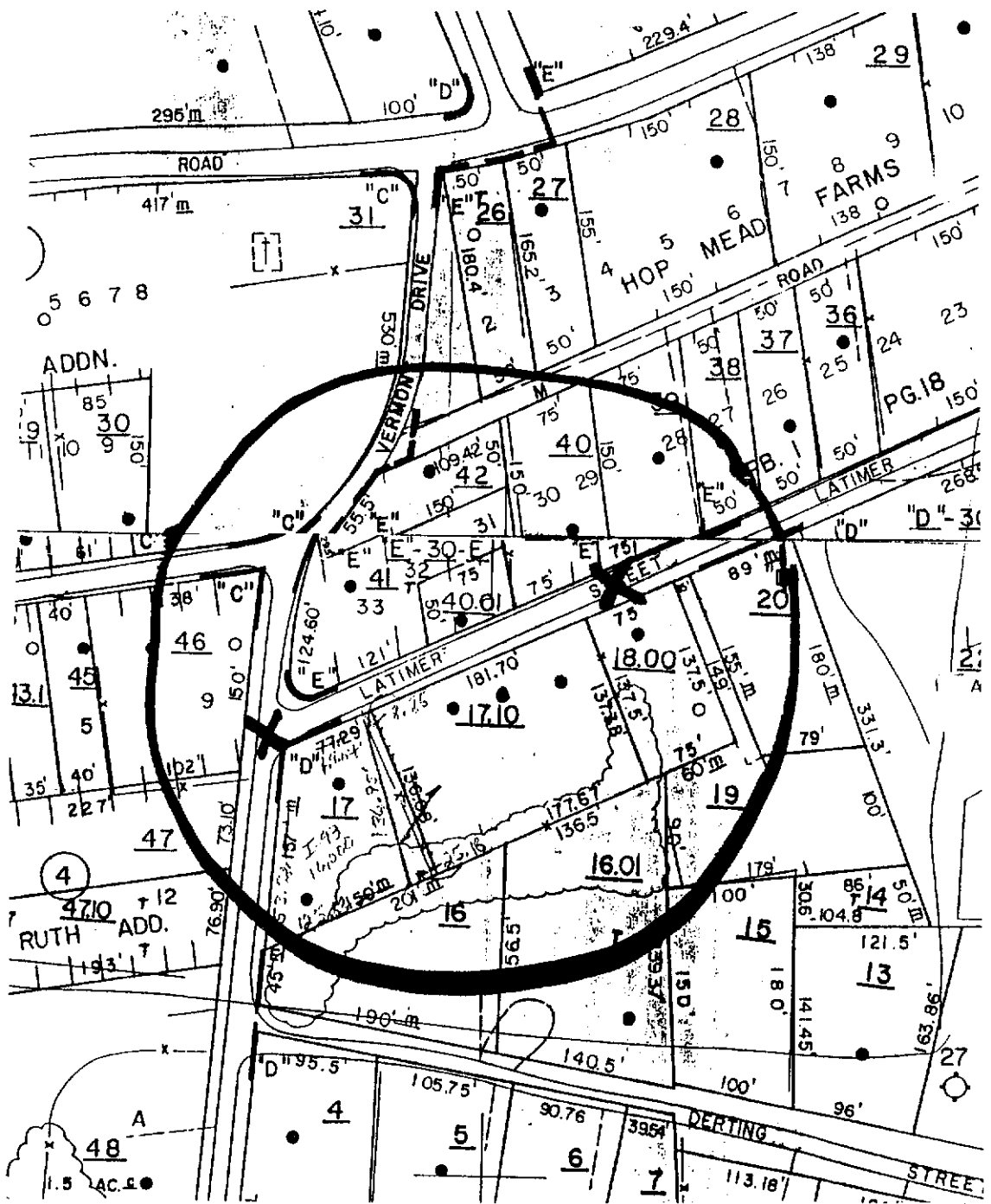




Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System

A RESOLUTION to allow credit in the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System for certain periods of military service rendered in the armed forces of the United States in accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-34-605

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-34-605 authorizes a political subdivision participating in the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System ("the System") to allow its employees to establish retirement credit for certain military service rendered in the armed forces of the United States; and

WHEREAS, said Section allows any such employee who is a member or retired member of the System, who served in the armed forces of the United States at any time from October 15, 1940 through May 7, 1975, to establish retirement credit for such military service on the basis of one (1) day of creditable service for each two (2) days of military service rendered; and

WHEREAS, the member must pay the employee contributions to establish the service based on a contribution rate of 9% which is applied to the member's earnable compensation at the time of the claim or, if not in service at the time of the claim, the member's earnable compensation at termination of employment; and

WHEREAS, Section 8-34-605 further allows any member or retired member of the System who served in the armed forces of the United States during a period of armed conflict, as defined in said Section, to establish retirement credit for such service without charge; and

WHEREAS, credit for the above peacetime and armed conflict military service is conditioned upon the following:

1. The credit cannot be established in any other retirement system;
2. The member was honorably discharged from such military service;
3. The credit shall be granted conditionally upon the member becoming vested, prior to vesting, the credit may not be used to establish any rights under the system; and
4. In no case shall the total amount of retirement credit granted for such military service exceed an aggregate of four (4) years.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners (Name of Governing Body) of Sullivan County (Name of Employer) hereby authorizes its employees to establish retirement credit in the System for military service rendered in the armed forces of the United States under the above provisions and agrees to accept the associated liability.

THAT WHEREAS, TCA 55-10-401 through 55-10-104 establishes an additional fine for DUI offenses which will amount to an increase in the fines assessed by the Courts and to be collected by the clerks of courts, and

WHEREAS, The collection of these fines will be separate and identified as DUI Treatment Fines, Account Number 42380 by the Clerk and the Accounting Department, and

WHEREAS, The statute specifically states that revenues collected but not expended by year end must be placed into a Reserved Fund Balance identified as Account Number 34151 Reserve for Alcohol and Drug Treatment, and

WHEREAS, Judge Frank Slaughter has established a program which meets the criteria under the statute to pay for the transportation of school children to visit the Sullivan County Courts and the Sullivan County Jail, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners approve the program established by Judge Frank Slaughter and appropriate \$1,500.00 to Account Numbers; Revenue; 42380.000 DUI Treatment Fines and expenditures; 53505.300 Education, DUI Treatment Fines with the following provision:





