SULLIVAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE RROCLAMATION To Honor And Recognize The Yuchi Nation

Whereas, the indigenous people known as the Yuchi Nation inhabited the southeast and the State of Tennessee. Their inhabited area was spelled T-A-N-A-S-I in the Yuchi language. It was pronounced as "Tana-see" – an Indian word meaning "the meeting place"; and

Whereas, the Yuchi Tribe was documented by a Spanish explorer in what is now central Tennessee. European colonial records from the 17th century note the Yuchi; and


Whereas, both historical and archaeological evidence exists documenting several Yuchi towns in the 18th century. Among these was Chestowee in southeastern Tennessee. In 1714, interigental hypermedian traders from South Carolina, the Cherokees attacked and destroyed the town of Chestowee; and

Whereas, the Yuchi people have an isolated language that appears to be unrelated to any other tribe; and

Whereas, President George W. Bush stated in a proclamation, "The strength of our Nation comes from its people. As the early inhabitants of this great land, the native peoples of North America played a unique role in the shaping of our Nation's history and culture. Their unique spiritual, artistic and literary contributions together with their vibrant customs and celebrations enliven and enrich our land".

Now, therefore, I, Steve Godsey, Mayor of Sullivan County, and the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners do hereby honor and recognize the Remnant Yuchi Nation in Tennessee as a Native American Indian Tribe and a very important part of America's early development and encourage our citizens to learn about and demonstrate respect for their culture, talents, and bravery.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused this seal of the County of Sullivan to be affixed this 21st day of January, 2014.

In 2010, for every \$1 in public funds invested in UT Extension, \$9.49 is returned to the people of Sullivan County.

Homeowners Helped

- 23 Master Gardeners learned about gardens, soil, pesticide safety, etc. in the 16 sessions.
- 94 Master Gardeners, and other gardeners, participated in projects at schools and in various communities, contributing 4100 volunteer hours at a value of \$82,000. Four garden coordinators reported 13,500 pounds of produce harvested and donated to organizations.

- 278 home gardeners attended 15 gardening programs conducted by UT Extension Master Gardeners.
- Grafting workshops resulted in 2,150 trees grafted with a success rate of 75%; attendees benefitted by 1,612 fruit trees with a value of the trees at \$32,250. 120 trees were planted in 7 orchards; participants reported receiving \$6500 from fruit sales.
- 41 plant disease and insect problems were diagnosed for gardeners and professionals.

Improved Production

- 24 beef producers attended Beef Quality Assurance Training sessions to qualify for \$304,100 TN AG Enhancement Grants.
- Co-sponsored a multi-county Cow-Calf Conference with nationally known speakers.
- Conducted a program on pinkeye prevention and treatment in beef cattle.
- Submitted 160 soil samples and 8 forage samples to UT Extension for processing, allowing producers to make better informed decisions concerning soil fertility and forages.
- Coordinated a two-day beef cattle tour for 28 beef producers to the Central Kentucky Region.
- 5 farmers were certified or recertified as Private Pesticide Applicators.
- 38 small landowners participated in a workshop focusing on making land profitable with an economic benefit of \$35.600.





Improved Quality of Life

- Conducted "Wellness Wednesday" for 12 weeks with 59 participants. Participants learned about food labels, portion control, etc. Thirty-nine participants completed the program and lost 440 pounds and walked 128,300 miles.
- "Can it Right" and a food preservation fair was held with 42 participants learning safe food preservation methods.
- 250 Sullivan County employees learned "How to Lower Sodium" in their diet and "Healthy Eating in the Workplace" at work sites.
- Agent is serving on "Healthy Kingsport"
 Committee as part of the Governor's
 Healthy Tennessee. A needs assessment
 was completed; thus, aiding in receiving
 grant dollars and impacting lives through
 education.
- 303 men and women participated in a networking endeavor with the Sullivan County Health Department with health screenings with a value of \$900,000+ to the participants. 93% of the participants reported they learned new health related information.

Families and Individuals Strengthened

- Park Jack William I are to the Berlinson

- Family and Consumer Education Club (FCE) members volunteered 27,000 hours, benefiting 37,494 Sullivan County residents with a value of \$597,000.00 utilizing the National Volunteer rate.
- 13 4-hour co-parenting classes were taught with 106 participants.

Tennessee Nutrition and Consumer Education Program (TNCEP)

- TNCEP coalition members, and others, volunteered hours which resulted in 161.12 percent of our in-kind match with a value of \$36,447.
- A Family Food Fair was held with 200 residents at Riverview Community.
 Participants learned new cooking skills and food safety skills. 14 other agencies worked with UT Extension, resulting in 180 hours volunteered and \$4342 in inkind.

4-H Youth Developed

UT/TSU Extension taught life skills to 1,683 4-H youth who participated in 77 clubs and 3 project groups during the 2013 program year.

Education Gained

- Youth learned about energy, technology, financial management, citizenship, leadership, and livestock projects through day camps, real life simulations, animal shows and project competitions.
- Sullivan County 4-H members were active on local, county, regional and state levels.
 Two members were state project finalists.
- 5 Junior High members were selected to attend State Academic Conference at UTK.
- 122 improved photography skills through participation in the 4-H Photo Search.
 3 photos were selected as State Winners.
- 15 4-H members participated in regional competitions in wildlife and livestock judging. The Jr. High livestock team placed 1st of 18 teams in Knoxville.
- 78 learned financial management in "On My Own" simulations.
- 77 teams from 19 county schools learned about Tennessee History, Agriculture, Family Consumer Sciences and 4-H through the 4-H Clover Bowl.

 The 5th grade team was regional champions (1st). The 4th and 6th grade teams were reserve champions (2nd).

Citizenship & Leadership Skills Gained

- Collected plastic for "Bags to Benches" project; resulting in diversion of 583 pounds of plastic from local landfills and a new composite bench at a value of \$500.
- 25 members participated in 4-H Honor Club with 3 new initiates.
- Two senior members became State
 4-H healthy lifestyle ambassadors.

Maintaining the Archives in Sullivan County, TN

Background Today we will consider two different resolutions that affect storage and maintenance of the Sullivan County Archives. One resolution pertains to creating additional storage space behind the main courthouse, referred to as the "old jail." The second resolution is describes a method of raising funds dedicated to the archives mission.

<u>Problem</u> Discussions in during various county government meetings have revealed the following problems:

- 1. Accessibility. Many archives are not easily accessible and not properly cataloged. Several documents are stored in a location known as the "Sullivan House" approximately five miles from the Courthouse and the archivist' office.
- 2. Funding shortfall. There is only one archivist and she also serves as the County Tourism officer. No cost data or reference to the county budget have been cited in either of the proposed resolutions, but both the Public Records Commission and County Commission "apparently" agree that a shortage of storage space exists.
- 3. Cataloging. The difference between record keeping and archive maintenance is not clear. Apparently much of the courthouse and Sullivan House is devoted to record storage that may not be related to the legal requirements to permanently maintain specific records (archives). We may be storing records that are not required to be maintained. If so, it complicates the issue of adequate storage space and accessibility.
- 4. No written plan. The County Commission has not received a written plan or been verbally briefed on a comprehensive plan to address the problems cited above, nor have we received detailed information regarding the costs of implementing any proposed solutions.
- 5. Lack of coordination between County Departments and the Public Records Commission. Further, the funding resolution, while legally permitted under state law, would impose fees on County residents for services that are not directly related to subsequent archiving.

Recommendation The County Commission should take no action until a detailed, written plan (including costs) is submitted to the Commission. Record keeping is an executive function. The County Commission has only a funding and general oversight role. However, several County Departments are affected by this issue, (essentially all that are required to maintain records that transition into archive status at some point), The County Public Records Commission also plays an important and legally proscribed role in archive maintenance. Therefore, recommend that the County Mayor serves as the coordinator of a joint County effort to resolve this situation and submit a detailed, coordinated plan to the Commission within 60 days of this meeting.

Resolution To Establish An Audit Committee For Sullivan County

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated (T.C.A) Section 9-3-405, encourages county governments to establish an independent Audit Committee, and provides that the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury (Comptroller) may require an Audit Committee in counties that (1) are in noncompliance with the accounting and financial reporting standards required by the Government Accounting Standards Board or (2) have recurring findings from the annual audit for three or more consecutive years that are determined by the Comptroller's office to be a material weakness in internal control or material noncompliance with government auditing standards; and

WHEREAS, the Comptroller and the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada recommends that all county governments establish an Audit Committee as a best practice and to assist the County Commission in the oversight of the public funds and financial reporting process; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Commission realizes the need, especially in today's current environment of fewer available resources, for increased transparency and accountability of public funds, and that the County Commission is ultimately responsible for ensuring that management is meeting its internal control and financial reporting responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission finds it to be in the best interests of Sullivan County to establish an Audit Committee;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commission of Sullivan County, meeting this 21st day of January, 2014 that:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the provisions of T.C.A. §9-3-405, the County Commission of Sullivan County does hereby establish an Audit committee to provide independent review and oversight of the county's financial reporting processes and the county's internal controls, a review of the external auditor's report and follow up on management's corrective action, and compliance with laws, regulations, and ethics.

SECTION 2. The Audit Committee will consist of three (3) members (no fewer than three members), to be comprised of members of the County Commission, citizens of Sullivan County, or a combination of both. To insure the committee's independence and effectiveness, no Audit Committee member will be an elected official (with the exception of elected county commissioners), employee, spouse of an official/employee, or person that comingles assets with an official/employee of Sullivan County. While committee members need not be accountants, they should possess sufficient knowledge and experience in finance, business, and accounting to

discharge the committee's duties. The members of the Audit Committee shall be appointed by the County Commission to staggered two (2) year terms. To establish staggered terms, the initial members of the committee shall be appointed so that half of the members serve 2 year terms and half serve 1 year terms. Thereafter all members shall be appointed to serve 2 year terms.

SECTION 3. Meetings of the Audit Committee shall be held in accordance with the provisions of T.C.A. §9-3-405. Meetings shall be subject to the open meetings provisions of T.C.A. Title 8, Chapter 44, except that upon a majority vote of those members in attendance for the public portion of a meeting, the Audit Committee may hold confidential, nonpublic executive sessions to discuss the following items as authorized in T.C.A. §9-3-405;

- (1) Items deemed not subject to public inspection under T.C.A. §§ 10-7-503 and 10-7-504, and all other matters designated as confidential or privileged;
- (2) Current or pending litigation and pending legal controversies;
- (3) Pending or ongoing audits or audit related investigations;
- (4) Information protected by federal law; and
- (5) Matters involving the reporting of illegal, improper, wasteful, or fraudulent activity under T.C.A. §9-3-406, where the informant has requested anonymity.

The Audit Committee will follow Roberts Rules of Order. Each year at its first meeting, the committee will elect a chairman, vice-chairman, and secretary. Meeting agendas will be prepared by the chairman and provided in advance to members along with appropriate briefing materials. Minutes of the Audit Committee meetings will be filed in the office of County Clerk.

SECTION 4. The committee shall have access to the services of a financial expert, either through a committee member or an outside party engaged by the committee for this purpose. Such financial expert should, through both education and experience, and in a manner specifically relevant to the county government section, possess (1) an understanding of generally accepted accounting principles and financial statements; (2) experience in preparing or auditing financial statements of comparable entities; (3) experience in applying such principles in connection with the accounting for estimates, accruals, and reserves; (4) experience with internal accounting controls; and (5) an understanding of Audit Committee functions.

SECTION 5. The duties and responsibilities of the Audit Committee are:

(a) To carefully review, upon completion of the county's annual audit, all audit findings in audit report and consult with the external auditors regarding any irregularities and deficiencies disclosed in the annual audit. The Audit Committee is empowered to meet with management to discuss audit findings and/or disagreements with the external auditors. The committee should satisfy itself that appropriate and timely corrective action has been taken by management to remedy any identified weaknesses. The committee should determine what corrective actions, if any, should be recommended to the County Commission.

- (b) To consider the effectiveness of the internal control system, including information technology security and control, review the effectiveness of the system for monitoring compliance with laws and regulations, and review the process for communicating the county's ethics policies to county personnel and monitoring compliance therewith.
- -(c)-To-establish a process by which employees, taxpayers, or other citizens may confidentially report suspected illegal, improper, wasteful or fraudulent activity under provisions of T.C.A. §9-3-406.
- (d) To annually present a written committee report detailing how it discharged its duties and any committee recommendations to the full County Commission.

SECTION 6. The Audit Committee will be adequately funded to carry out the duties and responsibilities as set out in this Resolution and under applicable law.

SECTION 7. This resolution creating the duties and responsibilities of the Audit Committee has been submitted to the Comptroller prior to approval by this legislative body, and this resolution conforms with the report issued by the Comptroller.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby authorizes that an Audit Committee be established for Sullivan County with the chairmen of the Administrative, Budget, and Executive Committees listed as sponsor and co-sponsors, serving as the initial members of the Committee with the Chairman of the Executive Committee serving an initial 1 year term and the Chairman(s) of the Budget and Administrative Committee serving 2 year terms.

This resolution shall take effect from and after its passage. All resolutions in conflict herewith are and the same rescinded insofar as such conflict exists.

RESOLUTION Authorizing Archives And Records Management Fee As Established In Accordance With Tennessee Code Annotated §10-7-408

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated §10-7-408 permits counties to enact an archives and record management fee to fund county archives, and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Department of Archives and Tourism is in need of funding for records space, and personnel for managing, scanning, and accessing its archival records, and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Public Records Commission unanimously recommends the creation of an archives and record management fee for Sullivan County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED By The Board Of County Commissioners Of Sullivan, Tennessee That:

SECTION 1. In accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated §10-7-408, which authorizes counties to establish an archives and record management fee, the county legislative hereby creates an archives and record management fee in accordance with the following schedule:

A) Courts of General Sessions, Circuit, Criminal, Probate, and Chancery:
A fee of \$5.00 for all public records filed with the clerks of court for the purpose of initiating a legal proceeding.

B) County Clerk:

A fee of \$5.00 for all marriage license applications

A fee of \$5.00 for all beer permit applications

A fee of \$5.00 for all notary public applications

A fee of \$5.00 for all vehicle titles, to include replacement titles

A fee of \$5.00 for all business license applications

C) Zoning Department:

A fee of \$5.00 for all building permit applications

A fee of \$5.00 for all rezoning requests

A fee of \$5.00 for all variance applications

A fee of \$5.00 for all stormwater permits

D) Highway Department:

A fee of \$5.00 for all driveway permits

A fee of \$5.00 for all road cut permits

SECTION 2.	Funds	collected	through	this	fee	are	designated	exclusively	for	duplicating,
storing, and ma	iintainin	g any reco	rds requi	red b	y lav	w to	be kept.			

SECTION 3. For purposes of collection, this Resolution shall take effect on the first day of May, 2014.

10-7-408. Appropriation of funds Filing fees.

- (a) The county legislative body of any county which creates a county records commission has the power to appropriate such funds as may be required for the carrying out of the purposes of this chapter including, but not limited to, the purchase or leasing of equipment, the equipping of an office and the payment of the expenses thereof, the furnishing of secretaries and clerical help and the employment of expert advice and assistance.
- **(b)** In any county, if the county legislative body creates a county records commission, then the county legislative body is authorized to:
- (1) Appropriate such funds as may be required for carrying out of the purposes of this chapter, including, but not limited to, the purchase or leasing of equipment, the equipping of an office and the payment of the expenses of the office, the furnishing of secretaries and clerical help, and the employment of expert advice and assistance; and
- (2) Establish and collect, through all entities creating public records, as defined in § 10-7-403, an archives and record management fee not to exceed five dollars (\$5.00) per document filed. Funds collected through this fee must be designated exclusively for duplicating, storing, and maintaining any records required by law to be permanently kept.
