THAT WHEREAS, The Budget Committee of the Sullivan County Commission of Sullivan County, Tennessee has reported on its deliberations and recommended the adoption of a tax rate for Sullivan County, Tennessee for the ensuing fiscal year effective July 1, 1995, and after due consideration by the entire County Commission, the following action is taken:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the County Commission of Sullivan County, Tennessee in session duly assembled, a quorum being present, on the 17th day of July, 1995, that the combined property tax for Sullivan County, Tennessee for the fiscal year effective July 1, 1995 and ending June 30, 1996 shall be the sum of \$2.86 on each \$100 of taxable property in said County, which shall be for the purpose of providing revenue for each of the following funds and otherwise conform to the following levies for the following uses and purposes, to wit:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING Appropriating \$20,000 to the Bristol City Library and \$30,000 to the Kingsport City Library

WHEREAS, TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED; SECTION _____ AUTHORIZES COUNTIES TO _____

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session on the 15th day of May 1995

THAT WHEREAS, Sullivan County provides [↑]funding for its five libraries located in the unincorporated areas of the County with property tax receipts from both city and non-city residents; and

WHEREAS, This method of funding the County's libraries creates an inequity in the allocation of property tax revenue since the libraries of Bristol and Kingsport do not receive comparable financial support, and

WHEREAS, Based on the amount of tax dollars allocated for the operation of the County's libraries, a parallel appropriation for the libraries of Bristol and Kingsport totalling about \$217,000 would be equitable and reasonable,

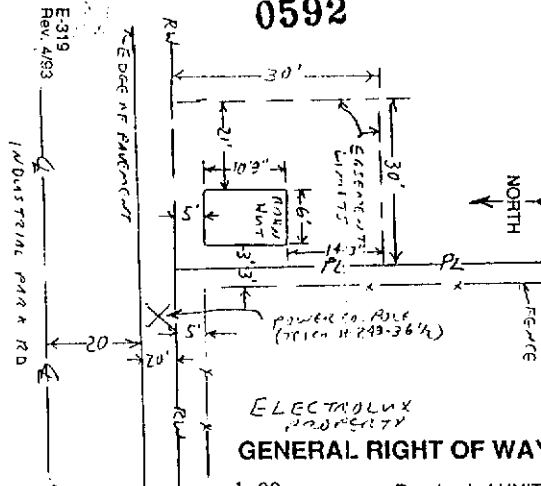

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register, and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the trustee and converted into the General fund as provided by law.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED. That if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, T.C.A., operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, T.C.A., provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407, T.C.A. One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That any appropriations made by this resolution which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. the salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the year ending June 30, 1996. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

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SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, T.C.A.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That the County Executive and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the year 1995-96 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Executive and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 1996.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That the delinquent County property taxes for the year 1994 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 1996 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 1994. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the year at June 30, 1996.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 1995, this resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

All resolutions in conflict herewith be and the same rescinded insofar as such conflict exist.

This resolution shall become effective on _____, 19____, the public welfare requiring it.

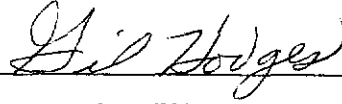
