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## SULLIVAN COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS July 15, 1996

Consider the following:

(1) File # 4/96-4 A request by Terry Leonard to rezone the property described below from A-1 to B-3;

WITHDRAWN BY APPLICANT 7/15/96

"Being a tract of land located in the 5th Civil District on the west side of New Carden Hollow Road approximately 4000 feet south of its intersection with State Route 126 and further described as that part of parcel 72.00 map 36 of the Sulfivan County Tax Maps lying west of Carden Hollow Road."

The Planning Commission took the following action:

"File No. 4/96-4, Terry Leonard Request

Terry Leonard requested that a tract of land located in the 5th Civil District on the west side of New Carden Hollow Road approximately 4000 feet south of its intersection with State Route 126 be rezoned from A-1 to B-3 to permit the location of an auto repair shop and mini storage building.

The applicant was present and spoke in support of the request. No opposition was presented. Staff stated that Carden Hollow road is not conductive to business development due to dangerous traffic conditions and the predominate residential agricultural character of development in the area. Staff reconumended the request be denied.

Motion Brown, second Barnes to deny the request as recommended by staff. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.

(2) File # 5/96-18 A request by Robert Steadman to rezone the property described below from R-1 to B-1;

APPROVED 7/15/96 ROLL CALL 22 Aye, 1 Nay, 1 Absent "Being a tract of land located in the 13th Civil District on the north side of Reservoir Road approximately 2000 feet west of its intersection with Hood Road and further described as parcel 1.00 map 90 of the Sullivan County Tax Maps."

The Planning Commission took the following action:

" File No. 5/96-18, Robert Steadman Request

Robert Steadman requested that a tract of land located in the 13th Civil District on the north side of Reservoir Road approximately 2000 feet west of its intersection with Hood Road be rezoned form R-1 to B-1 to permit the location of a gift shoot.

The applicant was present, spoke and presented a petition in support of the request. Ann Bowman and others in opposition to the request were present and presented a signed petition citing negative impact of the request including increased traffic, reduced residential property values and setting of an undesirable precedent. Attorney Tom Peters representing those in opposition to the request spoke noting that the request was not compatible with existing assidential, agricultural development and would negatively impact the area. Staff stated that the proposed business development would be inappropriate and incompatible with existing land use patterns - a contention supported by the Kingsport Land Use Plan - and recommended the request be denied.

Motion Barnes, second Brown to deny the request as recommended by staff. Vote in favor of the motion: Barnes Brown, Daniel: opposed: Kiser, Goodwin, Greene. The motion failed 3 to 3 due to the lack of a majority of the quotum present. No other motions were offered.

(3) File # 6/96-1 A request by Michael N. Davis to rezone the property described below from R-2 to PBD-3:

APPROVED 7/15/96 ROLL CALL 22 Aye, 1 Aye, 1 Nay

"Being a tract of land located in the 21th Civil District on the east side of Weaver Pike approximately 800 feet south of its intersection with Vance Tank Road and further described as parcel 109.00 map 68 of the Sullivan County Tax Maps."

The Planning Commission took the following action:

"File No. 6/96-1, Michael N. Davis Request

Michael N. Davis requested that a tract of land located in the 21th Civil District on the east side of Weaver Pike approximately 800 feet south of its intersection with Vance Tank Road be rezoned from R-2 to B-3 to permit the location of future business.

Ms. Davis was present representing the applicant. No opposition was presented. Staff recommended the request be changed to PBD-3 and approved to allow site plan review. The applicant accepted staff recommendation.

Motion Kiser, second Barnes to approve the request to PBD-3 as recommended by staff. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.

(4) File # 6/96-4 A request by Jack Tyler to rezone the property described below from R-3 to PBD-3:

APPROVED 7/15/96 ROLL CALL 23 Aye, 1 Absent "Being a tract of land located in the 6th Civil District on the north side of U.S. Hwy. 11-W approximately 2000 feet east of its intersection with Evergreen Drive and further described as parcel 69.00 group A map 33G of the Sullivan County Tax Maps."

The Planning Commission took the following action:

"File No. 6/96-4, Jack Tyler Request

Jack Tyler requested that a tract of land located in the 6th Civil District on the north side of U.S. Hwy. 11-W approximately 2000 feet east of its intersection with Evergreen Drive be rezoned from R-3 to B-3 to permit the location of a contractors office.

The applicant was present. No opposition was presented. Staff suggested that the area proposed to be zoned B-3 be reduced from 41 acres to encompass a smaller portion of the tract fronting US Highway 11-W to depth of approximately 150 feet. The applicant dectined staff proposal stating he wished the entire 41 acres to be zoned B-3. Commission members indicated they would consider zoning to PBD-3 to allow site plan review of the .41 acre tract. The applicant accepted this proposal. Staff did not appose the commission proposal.

Motion Brown, second Kiser to approve zoning of the entire 41 acre parcel 69.00 Group A tax map 33G to PBD-3. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.

(5) File #6/96-5 A request by Delmar and Martha Ward to rezone the property described below from A-I to B-I:

APPROVED 7/15/96 ROLL CALL 23 Aye, 1 Absent

"Being a tract of land located in the 16th Civil District on the east side of Elizabethton Hwy, approximately 1600 feet south of its intersection with Carr Hollow Road and further described as that part of parcel 12.00 map 136 of the Sullivan County Tax Maps lying east of the Elizabethton Hwy, adjacent to the south boundary of parcel 70.00."

The Planning Commission took the following action:

"File No. 6/96-5, Delmar and Martha Ward Request

Deirnar and Martha Ward requested that a tract of land located in the 16th Civil District on the east side of Elizabethton Hwy, approximately 1600 feet south of its intersection with Carr Hollow Road be rezoned from A-1 to B-1 to permit the location of a bern shop.

The applicant was present. No opposition was presented. Staff stated the request was compatible with existing land use patterns and recommended approval.

Motion Childress, second Hickam to approve the request as recommended by staff. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.

(6) File # 6/96-10 A request by Carolyn C. Clark to rezone the property described below from B-3 to R-1:


The Planning Commission took the following action:

Motion Hickam, second Barnes to approve the request as recommended by staff. Vote in favor of the motion unanimous.




Sullivan County, Tennessee From A-1 To B-3


Sullivan County, Tennessee From R-1 To B-1


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



REZONING REQUEST Sullivan County, Tennessee From A-1 To B-1



#### MUTUAL ALD AGREEMENT

This agreement entered in to this day of 1996 by and between the Elizabethton-Carter County Emergency Agency representing Emergency Services of Elizabethton-Carter County and the Sullivan County Emergency Management Agency representing Emergency Services for Sullivan County.

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 58-2-601 et seq, known as the Local Government Emergency Assistance Act of 1987, authorize public agencies of this state to enter into interlocal agreements for mutual assistance, and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto by this agreement avail themselves

of the authority conferred by this act, and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the parties hereto to provide each of the parties by mutual assistance commitment with a predetermined plan by which each might render aid to the other in case of emergency which demand Emergency Assistance Response services to a degree beyond the existing capabilities of either party, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the public interest for the parties hereto to enter into said agreement for mutual assistance in Emergency Assistance Response to assure each party of adequate

protection.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants

contained herein, the parties hereto agrees as follows:

1. The parties will respond to calls for Emergency Assistance Response assistance only upon request for such assistance made by the Emergency Manager Director or Team Leader for the requesting Agency or their designee. All requests for Emergency Assistance Response assistance shall be directed only to the senior officer on duty at the time with the entity from which aid is requested.

2. Each party's response, if any, to such call for assistance will be determined by the senior officer on duty with the responding party in the exercise of his sound discretion. Any decision reached by the aforesaid senior officer on duty as to such response shall be

final and shall not thereafter be questioned by anyone.

3. The conduct and actions of personnel for the responding Emergency Response Agency shall be the responsibility of the responding agency and personnel for the responding agency shall at all times be considered as employees of the responding agency.

4. The Agency responding to the request for mutual assistance under the terms of this agreement shall be liable and responsible for injury to personnel and the damage to its own apparatus and/or equipment. The responding agency shall also be liable and responsible for any damage caused by its own apparatus and/or negligence of its own personnel while in route to or returning from the scene of the emergency.

5. Neither the responding party nor its employees shall be liable for any property damage or bodily injury at the actual scene of any emergency due to actions which are performed in responding to

a request for emergency assistance.

6. No compensation will be paid by the parties under this agreement for said mutual assistance rendered, except as previously

provided.

7. The parties hereto agree that no claim for compensation will be made by any party against any other party for loss, damage or personal injury which may occur in consequence of mutual assistance rendered under this agreement, and all such right or claims are hereby expressly waived.

8. Officers of the responding agency shall be considered to be employee of the responding agency and to be acting within the course and scope of their employment for purposes under the Governmental Tort Liability Act or Worker's Compensation Law of the State of

9. The senior officer of the requesting agency on scene of the emergency shall in all instances be in command of the emergency as to strategy, tactics and overall directions of the operation. All orders or directions regarding the operations of the responding agency shall be relayed to the senior officer in command of the responding agency at the scene.

10. All personnel employed by the parties to this agreement shall, during such time that said personnel are actually providing aid outside the jurisdictional limits of the employing agency pursuant to a request for aid made in accordance with this agreement, shall have the same powers, duties, rights, privileges, and immunities as if said personnel were performing their duties within the political subdivision in which they are normally employed.

11. The party having financial responsibility for the agency providing services, personnel, equipment, or facilities utilized pursuant to the provision of this agreement shall bear any loss or damage to the same and shall pay any and all expenses incurred in the maintenance and operation of the same. Said party shall compensate all of its employees rendering aid pursuant to this agreement during the time of the rendering of such aid and shall defray the actual travel and maintenance expenses of such employees while they are rendering such aid. Such compensation shall include any amounts paid or due for compensation due to personal injury or death while such employees are engaged in rendering such aid, if such amounts would be due if the aforesaid personal injury or death had occurred within the normal jurisdiction of that party. Such compensation shall also include all benefits normally due such employees.

12. All exemption from ordinances and rules, and all privileges which apply to the activities of such officers, agents, or employees of any agency when performing their respective functions within the territorial limits of their respective agency's jurisdiction shall apply to them to the same degree, manner, and extent while engaged in the performance of any of their functions and duties extraterritorially under the provisions of this Mutual Aid Agreement. The provision of this agreement shall apply with equal effect to paid

and auxiliary employees.

13. Should the responding agency be notified of an emergency in the responding agencies home jurisdiction which would require the response of said agency, the team leader shall decide what resources will be deployed to the emergency in the agencies home jurisdiction. Should the officer in command of the responding party at the scene of the emergency decide to return all deployed resources to the agencies home jurisdiction, the responding agency shall have no liability to any party or parties for any damages or claims which might result from said decision.

14. This agreement may be canceled at the discretion of the Chief Executive Officer of any party upon sixty (60) days written

notice to all other parties.

15. This agreement shall take effect upon execution by the authorized representatives of each party after approval of the government body of each party, and shall remain in full force and effect until canceled as provided herein.




Pursuant to our telephone conversation earlier today, a situation has arisen that requires your assistance. We would like to resolve this so that everyone's best interests are served. As you know, Speedway Motorsports, Inc. and Bristol Motor Speedway are committed to an agressive expansion program that can only benefit Sullivan County and the entire east Tennessee region.

It is our stated goal to increase the seating capacity of the speedway to over 120,000 by 1998, making it the largest entertainment facility in the state of Tennessee. However, to accomplish this objective we need to be able to provide the egress and ingress necessary to move out fans in and out of the speedway.

Commissioner Bruce Saltsman at the Tennessee Department of Transportation has been most helpful in securing a waiver of limited access control off the new Bristol Beltway that will allow us to build a new four lane road through property we have acquired on the backside of the speedway. We are committed to paying all the costs involved in opening up this entrance for the August 23-24 races.

We would appreciate Sullivan County's assistance in accepting the roadway as a public county road eventhough we are committed to pay all costs of construction and upkeep.

It is absolutely crucial to the future of Bristol Motor Speedway to be able to feed cars onto the Bristol Beltway. Without this access, all plans for future expansion will be placed on hold. We believe our contribution to the economy of this area to be in the range of \$200 million a year. An additional 30-40,000 seats would only increase this amount.

#### COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

U. S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FOREST SERVICE CHEROKEE NATIONAL FOREST 2800 NORTH OCOEE STREET CLEVELAND, TN 37320

Under the Act of August 10, 1971, (PL 92-82) (16 USC 551a)

Whereas, the Forest Service, hereinafter referred to as the Service, has the responsibility for the enforcement of the Federal laws and regulations relative to the National Forest Service and,

Whereas, the Service recognizes that public use of such lands and water which are usually located in remote or sparsely populated areas, are attracting large numbers of visitors and,

Whereas, the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office hereinafter referred to as the cooperators, has the authority to enforce the State and local laws for Sullivan County on such lands and water and,

Whereas, the Cherokee National Forest is partially located in Sullivan County for which the cooperator has the responsibility of enforcement of state and local laws and.

Whereas, the cooperator is limited by level of financing as to the amount of protection, patrol, and investigation that can be provided at the more remote areas within the Cherokee National Forest,

Now, therefore, the parties hereby mutually agree that it is desirable to cooperate in better utilizing the resources of both agencies while providing for more adequate protection of persons and property, as follows:

- A. The Sullivan County Sheriff's Office agrees:
  - To continue to enforce the civil and criminal laws of the state and County on lands and water within or a part of any unit of the National Forest System within the normal scope of its duty without reimbursement by the Service.

- Upon specific request of the Service, to provide special services beyond those provided under Clause A-1 for the enforcement of State and local laws relating to the protection of persons and their property in accordance with the operating and financial plan required by Clause C-2.
- To furnish the Service, at intervals mutually agreed upon, itemized statements of expenditures incurred under Clause A-2 at the rates established by the annual operating and financial plan in Clause C-2.
- 4. To maintain accounting and performance records of the reimbursable expenses set forth in A-2 in a manner that will facilitate an examination by officials of the Service or other Federal officials who may be required to examine such records. Such records will be retained for a period of 3 years following the year the expenditures were incurred unless disposition is otherwise agreed to in writing.
- 5. That all Officers assigned to fulfill the services under this agreement will meet the same standards of training required of other Officers in his jurisdiction or will meet the State Peace Officers Standards of Training (POST) where they exist.
- 6. To furnish the Service in conjunction with the Statement of Expenditures required by Clause A-3, a Cooperative Law Enforcement Activity Report, 5300-5, identifying the number of crimes occurring on National Forest System land. The report will follow the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Groupings, Part I and Part II offenses. Offense and arrest information will be combined and reported for each crime. The report will separate the crimes handled under the cooperative agreement from those handled by the cooperator during regular duties.
- To enter designated wilderness areas for official use per guidelines established and set forth in the Cherokee National Forest Search and Rescue Plan (copy attached).
- B. The Service agrees, within availability of funds and established Service regulations and policies:
  - 1. To enforce the Federal laws and regulations relating to the National Forest System lands.
  - To provide support and cooperation to the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office in the enforcement of state and local laws on lands and water within or a part of any unit of the National Forest System.
  - To reimburse the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office for the special or support services provided under Clause A-2 at the rates established by the annual operating and financial plan in Clause C-2.
  - To follow required FCC procedures when operating radio(s) on cooperators frequency.

5. To support and assist the Sheriff on Search and Rescue operations in designated wilderness areas per guidelines established and set forth in the Cherokee National Forest Search and Rescue Plan (copy attached).

#### C. The parties mutually agree:

- To provide the maximum cooperation possible within the availability of funds and established laws, regulations, and policies governing the respective agencies that will assure the protection of persons and their property on land and water within or a part of any unit of the National Forest System.
- 2. To prepare and/or update annually an Operating and Financial Plan specifying the service to be provided and agreed rates for reimbursement. This plan, when signed by both parties, is attached to and made a part of this agreement. Each party will designate in the plan a specific individual and alternate(s) to make or receive requests for special services under this agreement.
- 3. That Officers and/or agents of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office performing services under this agreement in enforcing State and local laws are, and will remain, under the supervision, authority, and responsibility of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office. Such services provided by the cooperator and its employees shall not be considered as coming within the scope of Federal employment and none of the benefits of Federal employment will be conferred under this agreement.
- 4. In connection with the performance of work under this agreement, the provisions of Form AD-369, Equal Opportunity, attached, are hereby included as a part of this agreement. On Form AD-369, "Contractor" means "Cooperator," and Contracting Officer" and Contracting Agency" mean "Forest Service."
- 5. No member of, or delegate to, Congress, or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement or to any benefit that may arise therefrom; but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this agreement if made with a corporation for its general benefit.
- 6. The period of this agreement shall be from July 15, 1996 until September 30, 1996 or until terminated by mutual agreement or on 30 days written notice from either party to the other.
- 7. Any changes in the provisions of this agreement which are necessary and proper will be made by formal amendment. Changes may be made to the current operating plan by verbal agreement between the Forest Supervisor and the executive Officer, followed by a letter of documentation from the Forest Supervisor.

#### ATTACHMENT 1

#### Operating and Financial Plan

Reimbursable Services Requested by Forest Service

This plan, made and agreed to this 15th day of July 1996, for the period beginning July 15, 1996, and ending September 30, 1996, by and between the Forest Service and the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office, becomes a part of the agreement between said parties dated July 15, 1996.

- A. The Sullivan County Sheriff's Office agrees:
  - 1. To assign Patrol Units as needed to patrol the following areas:
    - a. Little Cak Campground
    - b. Jacob's Creek Campground
    - c. Jacob's Creek Job Corp Center
    - d. Forest Service Road #87 and #87d (Flatwoods Road)
    - e. Lake Access Area at Big Creek.

Patrols should be made as many times as practical, stressing patrols as least twice on Fridays and Saturdays between the hours of 1400 and 0300, and once on Sunday afternoons from July 15, 1996, through September 30, 1996. Additional patrols should be made the Sunday night immediately preceding Labor Day and daytime patrols on Labor Day itself.

The basic rate of billing for reimbursement services will be \$12.00 per hour and .30 cents per mile.

- To furnish the Forest Service an itemized statement by the fifteenth of each month, for expenditures of Clause A-1 above. The statement should be sent to District Ranger, Cherokee National Forest, 246 Highway 91, Elizabethton, TN. 37643.
- 3. The statement will be on the forms furnished by the Forest Service and in sufficient detail to allow the Forest Service to tie these expenditures back to the reimbursement expenses and the rate schedule. The statement will be certified by the Sheriff of Sullivan County, Tennessee as being current and proper.
- B. The Forest Service agrees:
  - 1. To reimburse the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office on receipt of satisfactory statements of expenditures in accordance with the rate schedule for the period established for this plan, but not to exceed \$7,000. Changes in this operating plan can be made by verbal
