Item 2 Administrative No. 2008-12-134

To the Honorable Steve M. Godsey, Mayor of Sullivan County, and the Board of Sullivan County Commissioners meeting in Regular Session this 15th day of December, 2008.

RESOLUTION To Improve Fire Safety Within The Borders Of Sullivan County

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has the obligation to our citizens to improve fire safety; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has no standards on the size of water service lines or the placement of fire hydrants serviced by any public utility provider; and

WHEREAS, there are areas within the borders of Sullivan County with insufficient supply line sizing and lack of sufficient fire hydrants for adequate fire safety.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby require all water utilities within the County, including all municipalities, to install fire hydrants and supply lines in all new, replacement, and upgrade construction to the standards required within residential areas inside the city limits of Kingsport or Bristol, Tennessee; and these be checked and maintained on a regular basis on a schedule no less than what's provided within the boundaries of the cities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any utility provides service to an industrial park or other major industrial site, sufficient water supply, line sizing and fire hydrants must be installed to meet or exceed any codes required within the city limits of Kingsport, Bristol, Tennessee, or any other utility district providing service in Sullivan County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that money to help facilitate this resolution be carmarked from the Health and Safety Program or Homeland Security Program in an amount no less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) annually and be dedicated to the rural portions of the County that have utility supplied water service and an insufficient supply line sizing or an insufficient number of fire hydrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$5,000 annually be put in each year's budget to help facilitate this resolution. This money is to be put in the Health & Safety program overall Planning & Zoning Department's Budget. The \$5,000 annually to be dedicated to the rural portions of the County that have utility supplied water service and no fire hydrants or an insufficient number of fire hydrants.

RESOLUTION Dissolving Historical Advisory Board and Establishing a Preservation and Tourism Advisory Board

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Historical Advisory Board was created by Resolution No. 2002-04-41, item #5, approved by the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners on May 20, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the initial purpose of the Historical Advisory Board was to review objectives in accepting donation of Old Deery Inn, Rutledge House and surrounding property from the Sullivan County Historical Preservation Association to Sullivan County in 2002; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County will be better served by the creation and support of a Preservation and Tourism Advisory Board; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Department of Archives and History and the Sullivan County Department of Tourism have merged and are now known as the Sullivan County Department of Archives and Tourism; and

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Department of Archives and Tourism shall be greatly enhanced by the creation and support of a Preservation and Tourism Advisory Board that shall replace the Historical Advisory Board; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby dissolves the Sullivan County Historical Advisory Board and establishes the Preservation and Tourism Advisory Board. The Preservation and Tourism Advisory Board shall consist of three (3) county commissioners (one from each of the three sections of the county: Bristol, Blountville and Kingsport) who shall be appointed by the Board of Commissioners and whose term shall be coterminous with their current term as a County Commissioner, the Director of the Sullivan County Department of Archives and Tourism, the President of the Historic Preservation Association, the President of the Historical and Genealogical Society, and the County Historian. The County Mayor shall be requested to serve on said Board as an exofficio member.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Preservation and Tourism Advisory Board shall provide the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners with a quarterly report summarizing its progress.

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This resolution shall take effect from and after its passage. All resolutions in conflict herewith be and the same rescinded insofar as such conflict exists.

- (a) The county mayor shall be the chief executive officer of the county and shall have all the powers and duties formerly exercised by the county judge, county chair, or elected official exercising general supervision of the county government as provided by this chapter, other general law, special, local or private acts.
- (b) (1) The county mayor shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member of the county legislative body. The county mayor or the county mayor's designated representative shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member of each committee of the county legislative body and of each board, commission or authority of the county government, except as provided by law or by action of the county legislative body.
- (2) In those circumstances not addressed by the provisions of subdivision (b)(1), the county mayor may designate, from time to time, a professional staff member with appropriate training or a member of the county legislative body to sit in the county mayor's place on any board, authority or commission that the county mayor serves upon by virtue of holding the office of county mayor. Any such designee shall have the powers, including the power to vote, as are otherwise conferred upon the county mayor when serving upon such board, authority or commission. At any such meeting attended by the county mayor, only the county mayor shall exercise voting power.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided by general law, or special or private act, the county mayor shall appoint members of county boards and commissions and county department heads. Such appointees shall be subject to confirmation by the county legislative body, and in so doing, the legislative body may express its views fully and freely and shall vote for or against confirmation. The legislative body shall not seek or interview such prospective employees prior to their appointment by the county mayor. Such appointment and confirmation are not applicable to employees appointed by other elected county officials.
