SUBSTITUTE RESOLUTION

To the Honorable Steve M. Godsey, Mayor of Sullivan County, and the Board of Sullivan County Commissioners meeting in Regular Session this 16th day of February, 2010.

RESOLUTION Clarifying The Residential Code Of Sullivan County For One And Two Family Dwellings (Hereinafter Residential Code) Relative To The Appointment Of The "Building Official" As Called For Therein; Clarifying The Property Maintenance Code Of Sullivan County (Hereinafter Property Maintenance Code) Relative To Appointment Of The "Code Official" As Called For Therein; Authorizing The "Building Official" And The "Code Official" To Appoint Inspectors For Violations Of The Residential Code And Establishing Fines And Penalties For Violations Of The Property Maintenance Code.

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners approved Resolution No. 2009-05-67 thereby adopting particular portions of the 2006 Edition of the International Residential Code and the 2006 International Property Maintenance Code for enforcement in Sullivan County as the Residential Code and the Property Maintenance Code respectfully, said regulations to become effective in Sullivan County on January 1, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the *Residential Code* mandates the appointment of the "Building Official", the official charged with the administration and enforcement of the *Residential Code*, and the method of appointment of such official needs to be established; and

WHEREAS, the *Property Maintenance Code* mandates the appointment of the "Code Official", the official charged with the administration and enforcement of the *Property Maintenance Code*, and the method of appointment of such official needs to be established; and

WHEREAS, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated 5-20-103(c)</u> provides that the county legislative body shall determine the method of appointment of the "Building Official" and the "Code Official"; and

WHEREAS, the *Property Maintenance Code* and the *Residential Code* provide that the county legislative body may authorize the "Code Official" and the "Building Official" to appoint inspectors to assist in the enforcement of these codes; and

WHEREAS, it is further necessary to establish monetary fines and penalties for violations of the *Property Maintenance Code* and the *Residential Code*.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session on the 16th day of February, 2010 that the "Building Official", as called for in the Residential Code, shall be appointed by the Sullivan County Mayor subject to the confirmation of the county legislative body; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the "Code Official", as called for in the *Property Maintenance Code*, shall be appointed by the Sullivan County Mayor subject to the confirmation of the county legislative body; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the "Code Official" and the "Building Official" shall have the authority to appoint inspectors to assist in the enforcement of the *Property Maintenance Code* and the *Residential Code* respectfully; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> §5-1-121, Sullivan County hereby establishes a monetary penalty not to exceed Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each violation of the *Residential Code* and a monetary penalty not to exceed Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each violation of the *Property Maintenance Code*.

This resolution shall take effect from and after its passage. All resolutions in conflict herewith be and the same rescinded insofar as such conflict exists.



Whereas. The Animal Control Officers assisted in 3,615 phone and service calls in 2009 as well as 43 cruelty cases; and







Consideration of Zoning Text Amendments to Commercial/Recreational Sport Shooting Ranges Indoor and Outdoor Facilities:

. The Guidelines for Indoor Shooting Ranges shall at a minimum adhere to and provide for the following:

A minimum acreage requirement of lacre;

Noise Abatement Plan:

Safety Plan;

- o All facilities shall be on properties that front along publicly maintained roads and not served solely by private roads or easements;
- o Comprehensive Site Plan detailing facility layout, parking, buffering, surrounding zoning and surrounding land uses, setbacks, signage and all other details required per Article 12-102.3;

o Meet or exceed the minimum design standards as detailed in the NRA Manual depending on type of facility; and

 Prepare an Existing Land Use Map illustrating any established residential use or subdivision within 1,000 feet of the proposed facility (per TCA 13-3-412).

Zoning Codification:

Should be allowed as a <u>Use on Review</u> by Planning Commission in the following districts: AR; B-3; B-4; PBD; and PBD-3 (amend Table 4-102A, Part III W. to reflect PC approval for these districts under the new subcategory called Commercial Recreational - Limited for Indoor Shooting Ranges) and allowable under all manufacturing districts (amend Table 5-102A, Part II K. to add PC approval for these districts under the new subcategory called Commercial Recreational - Limited for Indoor Shooting Ranges;.

o Add the new subcategory to Appendix B-103.3 Commercial Activities #21; and

• Add the above Supplemental Guidelines to Appendix B-104.7 part 7 — Commercial Recreational — Limited: Indoor Shooting Ranges (new subcategory).

• The Guidelines for Outdoor Shooting Ranges shall at a minimum adhere to and provide for the following:

- o Minimum acreage for site to be 20 acres;
- Noise Abatement Plan;

Safety Plan;

- Minimum separation of shooting range facility to any other parcel of land to be twice the length of the shot fall area established in the NRA Manual;
- o All facilities shall be on properties that front along publicly maintained roads and not served solely by private roads or easements:
- o Comprehensive Site Plan detailing facility layout, including future facilities, amenities, camping, utilities, parking, expansions, buffering, signage, and all other details required per Article 12-102.3;

Meet or exceed the minimum design standards as detailed in the NRA Manual depending on type of facility;

o Prepare an Existing Land Use Map illustrating any established residential subdivision or residential land use within 1,000 feet of the proposed facility (per TCA 13-3-412).

Zoning Codification:

O Should be allowed as a <u>Use on Review</u> by Planning Commission in the following districts: AR (Agricultural Recreational) District and allowable under all manufacturing districts {amend Table 3-102A, Part III B add Outdoor Shooting Range category to reflect PC approval for these districts under the Recreational – Commercial Activity Category – Limited for Outdoor Shooting Ranges and amend Table 5-102A, Part II K for PC approval for these districts under– Recreational Commercial for Outdoor Shooting Ranges;

o Add the new subcategory to Appendix B-103.3 Commercial Activities #21; and

o Add the above Guidelines to Appendix B-104.7 part 7— Commercial Recreational — Limited: Outdoor and Indoor Shooting Ranges (new subcategory).

SUMMARY OF CHANGES:

- Indoor Shooting Ranges shall be reviewed by the Sullivan County Regional Planning Commission as a <u>Use on Review</u> in most commercial districts, the AR district and all manufacturing districts under the new subcategory called Commercial Recreational Limited.
- Outdoor Shooting Ranges shall be reviewed by the Sullivan County Regional Planning Commission as a <u>Use on Review</u> in AR districts and all manufacturing districts under the new subcategory called Commercial Recreational Limited. No outdoor shooting ranges in commercial, agricultural or residential zones.
- All shooting ranges must follow the <u>Supplemental Development Standards</u> to be added to Appendix B 104.7 parts 7 Section 1 and 2 respectively and the most current edition of the NRA Manual.

RESOLUTION To Improve Fire Safety Within The Borders Of Sullivan County

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has the obligation to our citizens to improve fire safety; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has no standards on the size of water service lines or the placement of fire hydrants serviced by any public utility provider; and

WHEREAS, there are areas within the borders of Sullivan County with insufficient supply line sizing and lack of sufficient fire hydrants for adequate fire safety.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby require all water utilities within the County, including all municipalities, to install fire hydrants and supply lines in all new, replacement, and upgrade construction to the standards required within residential areas inside the city limits of Kingsport or Bristol, Tennessee; and these be checked and maintained on a regular basis on a schedule no less than what's provided within the boundaries of the cities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any utility provides service to an industrial park or other major industrial site, sufficient water supply, line sizing and fire hydrants must be installed to meet or exceed any codes required within the city limits of Kingsport, Bristol, Tennessee, or any other utility district providing service in Sullivan County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that money to help facilitate this resolution be earmarked from the Health and Safety Program or Homeland Security Program in an amount no less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) annually and be dedicated to the rural portions of the County that have utility supplied water service and an insufficient supply line sizing or an insufficient number of fire hydrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$5,000 annually be put in each year's budget to help facilitate this resolution. This money is to be put in the Health & Safety program overall Planning & Zoning Department's Budget. RESOLUTION Opposing Unfunded Local Government Mandates And Additions To Local Government Maintenance Of Effort Requirements

WHEREAS, counties have been hard hit by the economic downturn and are struggling to fund their budgets in the face of drastically diminishing revenue collections, just as the state is doing; and

WHEREAS, county governments in Tennessee are fundamental political subdivisions of our State and already are the primary providers of numerous essential government services including, but not limited to, public K-12 education, jails and law enforcement, road building and maintenance, election administration and voter registration, property assessment, solid waste disposal, record keeping and administration for the various state courts, and the many services provided by the offices of County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register of Deeds, Property Assessor, Elections Administrator, Trustee, Sheriff, and Highway Superintendent; and

WHEREAS, counties are required under existing laws to maintain certain levels of funding for numerous services they provide, including but not limited to education, law enforcement, highways and roads, and libraries; and

WHEREAS, county governments have limited taxing powers under state law and have limited sources of revenue available to them to fund the services they provide; and

WHEREAS, property values and income levels are declining, and increases in property taxes will be especially difficult in the current economic environment; and

WHEREAS, even before the current economic downturn, counties were struggling to find sufficient revenue sources to meet the growing demands of their citizens for services which are vital to the health, welfare, and safety of the people of this state, to provide improvements to infrastructure required by population and economic growth, and to meet constitutional responsibilities and state legislative mandates such as those required by the state's Basic Education Program; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Constitution, in Article II, Section 24, provides that no law of general application shall impose increased expenditure requirements on cities or counties unless the General Assembly shall provide that the state share in the cost; and

WHEREAS, in dealing with the state's budget crisis it must be remembered that county governments are facing the same budget crisis coupled with an inability to secure alternate sources of revenue; and

WHEREAS, in balancing the state's budget, the General Assembly should not cut state funding to programs and pass the cost of funding those programs to counties; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session, hereby requests the following:

- 1. The Tennessee General Assembly is strongly urged to pass no new laws imposing increased expenditure requirements on counties unless the General Assembly provides additional funding to cover the increased expenditures; and
- 2. The Tennessee General Assembly is strongly urged to eliminate programs or continue to fund them at the state level, rather than passing these responsibilities to county governments; and
- 3. The Tennessee General Assembly is strongly urged to pass no laws that would increase above current levels any maintenance of local funding requirements ("maintenance of effort"), including but not limited to education funding.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk shall mail certified copies of this Resolution to the Governor, the Speaker of the House and the Lieutenant Governor, and the members of the Tennessee General Assembly representing the people of Sullivan County.
