

WHEREAS, Dr. Acuff has been County Historian for thirteen years and has shared her knowledge and expertise with the citizens of Sullivan County; and





# RESOLUTION To Appropriate Funds to Provide School Resource Officers for Sullivan County Schools

WHEREAS, the School Resource Officer Program (SRO) is an innovative approach to community service and is designed to establish a positive relationship between law enforcement and young people while fostering a safer learning environment; and the SRO Program is a nationally accepted concept with goals of reducing violence, deterring drug and alcohol use, and a general reduction in juvenile crime; and the SRO's are not just "cops on campus", rather they are positive role models who interact with students in a supportive manner; and they perform varied duties at each school, which are based on the needs of the students and teachers at the school where they are assigned; and

WHEREAS, an SRO is a certified law enforcement officer who is permanently assigned to provide coverage to a school; and the SRO is specifically trained to perform three roles: law enforcement officer; law-related counselor; and law-related education teacher; and the SRO is not necessarily a DARE officer (although many have received such training), security guard, or officer who has been placed temporarily in a school in response to a crisis situation but, rather acts as a comprehensive resource for his/her school; and

WHEREAS, recent incidents of violence and criminal activity occurring on school premises have been the subject of much discourse in the media and these incidents are not limited to high schools, but have been manifest on middle school campuses, as well; and

WHEREAS, the surrounding counties have implemented SRO's into their middle schools to promote safety and enhance instruction time; and

WHEREAS, the presence of a SRO and a law enforcement agency cruiser on a school's premises and the assignment to such a school of a SRO, with the authority to arrest those who violate the law, constitutes a substantial deterrent to violent acts and criminal activity at school;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session, shall direct funds be appropriated to the budget of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Department for the exclusive purpose of providing for the placement of four school resource officers, beginning immediately in the 2006-07 academic year, increasing the number of those officers from the four presently serving, to eight.

BE IT RESOLVED that the funding estimated to be in the amount of \$184,830.00 for an entire school year would be divided as follows:

- 25% From the current budget of the Sullivan County Department of Education,
- 25% From the current budget of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office, and
- 50% New funds from Account 39000 as allocated by the Sullivan County Commission.

BE IT RESOLVED that the assignment of those officers shall be stipulated by agreement of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office and the Sullivan County Department of Education. And that the Sheriff's Office and the Department of Education shall monitor the effectiveness of said program for a period of one year and then determine the status of said program.

#### Dear Commissioners:

For approximately one year a group of commissioners have tried to persuade Sullivan County Commissioners, Departmental Heads, and public officials the importance of appropriating funds to place School Resource Officers in Sullivan County Middle schools. In order to validate and substantiate this concept, I will set forth the reasons and explanations that corroborate this belief.

### 1. What is a SRO (School Resource Officer)?

He/She is a certified law enforcement officer who is permanently assigned to provide coverage to a school. The SRO is specifically trained to perform three roles:

- a) Law enforcement officer
- b) Law-related counselor and mentor, and
- c) Law-related teacher. The SRO is not necessarily a DARE officer or security guard assigned to a school for crisis intervention, but rather acts a comprehensive resource for the school.

### 2. What is the urgency of the hiring of SRO's?

- Recent incidents of violence and criminal behaviors have escalated on school premises, especially in the middle schools, on the national and local levels. Data generated by the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office states that the number of calls from middle schools have resulted n a total of 560 incidences since August 2005 to November 2006 in which an officer was dispatched to the specific school. Traffic violations were part of this total number, but the majority of calls were due to assaults, drug violations, possession of lethal weapons and other serious misbehavior.
- Sullivan County Board of Education and other systems have installed security cameras, mandated the use of school passes, provided training for staff development, initiated one door entrances and implemented many programs on substance abuse, conflict resolution and effective decision-making. However, school violence and serious juvenile crime continues to increase. The National Center for Juvenile Justice reports that 90% of the schools that utilize SRO's have reported a significant reduction in school violence and drug activity, while enhancing instructional learning.

### 3. What are some logical reasons for the placement of an SRO's in our middle schools?

- a. If the mere presence of an SRO or law enforcement agency cruiser saves one life or prevents a student from being physically assaulted or emotionally scarred, the dividends of placement of a SRO could never be measured.
- b. The cost for keeping an inmate in the Sullivan County jail is approximately \$12,000. If the presence or influence of one officer could keep one student from entering a life of crime, the investment would be justified financially.
- c. Program would than be more than cost effective if the time and expense were calculated by the dispatching of law enforcement officers and their vehicle to school premises.
- d. The placement of SRO's would not only establish a more positive approach between law enforcement and young people, but foster a safer learning environment and improve instructional time
- e. Determent of substance use, reduction in violence, and a general reduction in juvenile crime would be the immediate results of this program.
- f. SRO's would be positive role model who interact with students in a supportive manner.

### 4. How would the programs effectiveness be measured?

The effectiveness of the SRO program would be informally measured through the
monitoring of juvenile crime, school violence, and criminal incidents through the
coordinated efforts of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office and the Sullivan County Board
of Education

Your consideration and approval of this resolution would reaffirm that we believe the safety of our students is of utmost importance.

#### **CODE OF ETHICS**

2005

#### I. INTRODUCTION

The Board of Directors of the Sullivan County Economic Development Partnership (the "Partnership") has adopted this Code of Ethics to provide our partners, directors, employees, vendors, and members of the general public with an official statement of the fundamental principles that govern how the Partnership will conduct its business.

Under the Code, our directors and employees should conduct business for the Partnership in the full spirit of honest, ethical and lawful behavior and should not cause another director or employee or non-employee to act otherwise, either through inducement, suggestion or coercion. The purpose of this Code is to promote: (1) honest and ethical conduct, including the ethical handling of conflicts of interest and (2) compliance with applicable laws, rules and regulations.

This Code applies to all directors and employees of the Partnership. All directors and employees should be familiar with the Code. All directors and employees will be asked annually to read and sign the Code. This Code is not a contract (express or implied) but rather a pronouncement of the Partnership's desire to promote exemplary ethical behavior by its employees, officers, directors and agents in the conduct of all of Partnership business.

#### II. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Employees and directors of the Partnership must avoid situations where their personal interests could conflict or appear to conflict with the interests of the Partnership. Conflicts of interest may arise when an individual's position or responsibilities with the corporation present an opportunity for personal gain apart from the normal compensation an employee receives through employment. To help avoid conflicts (and the appearance thereof), the following guidelines have been developed.

#### Use of Corporate Funds and Assets

The assets of the Partnership are much more than our offices, furnishings, equipment, cash deposits, funds, computers and other tangible items. The Partnership's assets include prospective client lists, marketing concepts, business strategies and plans, investment and development programs, as well as information about our business. These assets may not be improperly used to provide personal gain for employees. Nor may employees provide others with the assets of the Partnership. The theft or diversion of money, property or other assets will not be tolerated.

#### Confidential Information

As part of your job, you may have access to confidential information about the Partnership and our clients, vendors, business partners and business prospects. Unless properly released to the public, this information should not be disclosed to fellow employees who do not have a business need to know or to non-employees for any reason, except in accordance with established corporate procedures. Confidential information of this sort includes information or data on business prospects, potential economic development projects, business strategies, acquisitions, client information, our partnership manuals, processes, systems, procedures, and our financial and other proprietary information. Much of

the financial information the Partnership may have from time to time about business prospects and our existing business partners and contacts is subject to their legal rights to privacy, and our privacy and confidentiality policies must be strictly adhered to preserve these rights. The duty to protect the confidences of the Partnership and its clients includes avoiding not only intentional disclosures but also taking care to avoid unintentional or indirect disclosure.

#### Personal Financial Gain

Directors and employees should avoid any outside financial interests that might interfere or unduly influence their corporate decisions or actions on behalf of the Partnership. This does not prohibit investments in or relationships with other companies that compete with or do business with the Partnership so long as the investment or relationship does not interfere with the director or employee's exercise of independent judgment in fulfilling responsibilities to the Partnership.

If you feel you may have a conflict of interest due to your non-Partnership investments, you should seek guidance from the Partnership's Executive Committee.

#### **Outside Activities**

Employees should avoid outside employment or activities that would have a negative impact on their job performance with the Partnership, or which are likely to conflict with their obligations to the Partnership. No employee may engage in personal activities that conflict with the best interests of the Partnership or our clients. An employee who performs work for a company with which the Partnership does business or competes with must disclose that interest or work to the Partnership's Executive Director.

#### Corporate Opportunities

Any opportunity for personal investment which comes to the attention of any employee or director of the Partnership and which in any way relates to or might involve the business plans, strategies or opportunities of the Partnership is considered a "corporate opportunity." Each employee and director is prohibited from using his or her position to take advantage of a "corporate opportunity" that properly belongs to the Partnership, whether or not the corporate opportunity is discovered through the performance of duties to the Partnership. Similarly, an employee or director may not appropriate a "corporate opportunity" for the benefit of his family members, business associates or his or their business organization.

#### Disclosure and Abstention

Each employee and director is expected to disclose any actual or potential conflict of interest at the earliest possible date and in a manner sufficient to enable the Partnership to assess the ramifications of such conflict of interest. Each employee's disclosure should be made to the Executive Director. Each director's disclosure should be made to the Chairman of the Board. As required by applicable law, each employee involved in an actual or potential conflict of interest situation must refrain from any attempt to influence the decision of the Partnership with regard to such matter. Each director must

abstain from any discussions or deliberations of the Board of Directors and must abstain from voting or attempting to influence the vote of the Board of Directors on any matter in which he has or may have any form of personal interest, whether financial or otherwise.

#### III. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

In the fulfillment of their responsibilities to the Partnership, all employees and directors are required to conduct themselves in a professional and ethical manner to promote the Partnership's compliance with laws of federal, state and local governments applicable to the Partnership as well as the rules and regulations of private and public regulatory agencies having jurisdiction over the Partnership. From time to time, the Partnership may implement policies and procedures designed to ensure compliance with laws and regulations, and employees should make every effort to abide by these policies and procedures at all times.

#### IV. DEALING WITH CLIENTS AND VENDORS

The following guidelines are intended to help all employees make the appropriate decision in potentially difficult or confusing situations.

#### "Kickbacks" and Rebates

No employee or director may accept, for themselves or their family members or their respective business organizations, any personal kickbacks, rebates or other payments (regardless of form, whether in money, property or services) which are in any way connected to or result from any business activities of the Partnership.

#### Gifts and Entertainment

To avoid both the reality and the appearance of improper relations with business contacts, clients or vendors, the following standards apply to receipt of gifts and entertainment by directors and employees of the Partnership:

#### Gifts

- You may not accept gifts of money under any circumstances nor may you solicit non-money
  gifts, gratuities, or any other personal benefit or favor of any kind from any business, firm or
  individual doing or seeking to do business with the Partnership.
- You and members of your immediate family may accept unsolicited, non-money gifts from a business, firm or individual doing or seeking to do business with the Partnership but only if: (1) the gift is of nominal intrinsic value; (2) the gift is advertising or promotional material; or (3) the gift is reasonable under the circumstances and otherwise complies with any Partnership policies and procedures that may be applicable to you.

#### Entertainment

- Directors and employees may offer and/or accept meals, invitations to athletic events and other entertainment to or from business contacts, clients or prospective clients if the entertainment is of reasonable value, appropriate in the context of your position with the Partnership and the Partnership's business objectives, and in accordance with applicable Partnership policies. Employees should not, however, encourage or solicit entertainment from a business, firm or individual because they are doing or seeking to do business with the Partnership.
- Employees will be reimbursed for entertainment expenses only in accordance with Partnership
  policies and procedures as in effect from time to time.

#### Payments to Brokers, Agents, Consultants

Agreements with brokers, agents, sales representatives, and consultants must be in writing and must clearly and accurately set forth the services to be performed, the basis for earning the commission or fee involved, and the applicable rate or fee. Payments must be reasonable in amount and commensurate with the value of services rendered.

#### V. FINANCIAL BOOKS AND RECORDS

False or artificial entries shall not be made in the books or records of the Partnership for any reason; to do so may result in criminal and/or civil penalties to the Partnership and/or employee. No employee may engage in an arrangement that in any way may be interpreted or construed as misstating or otherwise concealing the nature or purpose of any entries in the financial books and records of the Partnership.

#### Falsification of Records

No payment or receipt on behalf of the Partnership may be approved or made with the intention or understanding that any part of the payment or receipt is to be used for a purpose other than that described in the documents supporting the transaction. "Slush funds" or similar funds or accounts where no accounting for receipts or expenditures is made on the Partnership's books are strictly prohibited.

#### Retention of Records

All employees must comply with the Partnership's records retention policies. Destruction, concealment or falsification of any documents required by law to be retained is strictly prohibited.

#### VI. FAIR DEALING

All employees and directors of the Partnership must uphold the highest standards of fair, honest and ethical conduct in all business dealings with our clients and business contacts, with other employees, with vendors and partners, and with the general public.

#### Information About Competing Projects or Opportunities

As a participant in the economic development of Sullivan County, Tennessee, the Partnership seeks knowledge about other economic development projects or opportunities which might be competitive with the Partnership. However, we will not engage in illegal or improper acts to acquire such information.

#### VII. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS

The Partnership encourages each of its employees to be good citizens and to fully participate in the political process. Employees should, however, be aware that: (1) federal law prohibits the Partnership from contributing to federal political candidates, political parties or party officials; and (2) employees who participate in partisan political activities must make every effort to ensure that they do not leave the impression that they speak or act for the Partnership.

#### VIII. ENFORCEMENT

#### **Board of Directors**

The Board of Directors of the Partnership is responsible in its oversight role to assure that the business practices of the Partnership are conducted in accordance with this Code of Ethics.

In all cases, the Partnership Board of Directors will assure that the legal rights of individuals are protected, that the Partnership's legal obligations are fulfilled, and that proper disciplinary and legal action is taken if violations occur. The Board of Directors will also see that corrective measures are taken consistently and safeguards are instituted to prevent recurrence of violations.

#### Reporting of Violations

As a Partnership employee, you are expected to report without delay all unethical, dishonest or illegal activities or financial improprieties by other employees. Employees are encouraged to contact the Chief Executive Officer, the Chairman of the Partnership Board of Directors, or the Executive Committee with any concerns about wrongdoing or questionable practices of any kind within the Partnership. Submission of Code violations may be made in person or in writing to any of the above mentioned persons and must include a description of the factual basis for the allegations (e.g., documents, meetings, communications and other events). The Partnership reserves the right to require that any report be reduced to writing. Each written report must be dated and signed by the person making the report.

#### Failure to Report

Failure to submit information regarding suspected Code violations is itself a violation of this Code as is the submission of facts which are known to be false.

#### No Retaliation

It is a serious Code violation, and a violation of law, for any director or employee to initiate or encourage reprisal action against an employee or other person who in good faith reports known or suspected Code violations. Retaliation will not be tolerated.

#### Chief Executive Officer and Managers

The Chief Executive Officer and other managers of the Partnership are responsible for advocating full compliance with the Code by all personnel and are required to report any actual or alleged material Code violations and any potential wrongdoing or financial improprieties. The Chief Executive Officer and other managers are also responsible for reviewing this Code with employees under their supervision and ensuring that it is countersigned annually and placed in the employee's personnel file. New employees must read and sign the Code as a part of beginning employment with the Partnership.

#### Request for Waivers and Exceptions

Waivers or exceptions to this Code of Ethics, if any, may only be granted by the Partnership Board of Directors, or an appropriate independent committee of the Board. Any waivers of or exceptions to this Code will be publicly disclosed on a timely basis and will include an explanation for any such waiver or exception. In addition, any changes to this Code of Ethics will be publicly disclosed on a timely basis.

#### Penalties

Violations of this Code of Ethics are a serious matter and will be the basis for disciplinary action, including reprimand, loss of compensation, seniority or promotional opportunities, demotions or dismissal. Suspected and reported violations will be investigated and any violation will be dealt with fairly.

#### IX. EMPLOYEE STATEMENT

I acknowledge having received a copy of the Partnership's Code of Ethics. I have read it completely and reviewed it with my immediate supervisor.

I understand how the Code applies to me and agree to fully comply with each of its provisions.

I understand that the Code is not intended to set forth either express or implied contractual obligations of the Partnership. The Partnership retains the right to change the provisions of this Code at any time.





WHEREAS, Dr. Acuff has been County Historian for thirteen years and has shared her knowledge and expertise with the citizens of Sullivan County; and





# RESOLUTION To Appropriate Funds to Provide School Resource Officers for Sullivan County Schools

WHEREAS, the School Resource Officer Program (SRO) is an innovative approach to community service and is designed to establish a positive relationship between law enforcement and young people while fostering a safer learning environment; and the SRO Program is a nationally accepted concept with goals of reducing violence, deterring drug and alcohol use, and a general reduction in juvenile crime; and the SRO's are not just "cops on campus", rather they are positive role models who interact with students in a supportive manner; and they perform varied duties at each school, which are based on the needs of the students and teachers at the school where they are assigned; and

WHEREAS, an SRO is a certified law enforcement officer who is permanently assigned to provide coverage to a school; and the SRO is specifically trained to perform three roles: law enforcement officer; law-related counselor; and law-related education teacher; and the SRO is not necessarily a DARE officer (although many have received such training), security guard, or officer who has been placed temporarily in a school in response to a crisis situation but, rather acts as a comprehensive resource for his/her school; and

WHEREAS, recent incidents of violence and criminal activity occurring on school premises have been the subject of much discourse in the media and these incidents are not limited to high schools, but have been manifest on middle school campuses, as well; and

WHEREAS, the surrounding counties have implemented SRO's into their middle schools to promote safety and enhance instruction time; and

WHEREAS, the presence of a SRO and a law enforcement agency cruiser on a school's premises and the assignment to such a school of a SRO, with the authority to arrest those who violate the law, constitutes a substantial deterrent to violent acts and criminal activity at school;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session, shall direct funds be appropriated to the budget of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Department for the exclusive purpose of providing for the placement of four school resource officers, beginning immediately in the 2006-07 academic year, increasing the number of those officers from the four presently serving, to eight.

BE IT RESOLVED that the funding estimated to be in the amount of \$184,830.00 for an entire school year would be divided as follows:

- 25% From the current budget of the Sullivan County Department of Education,
- 25% From the current budget of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office, and
- 50% New funds from Account 39000 as allocated by the Sullivan County Commission.

BE IT RESOLVED that the assignment of those officers shall be stipulated by agreement of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office and the Sullivan County Department of Education. And that the Sheriff's Office and the Department of Education shall monitor the effectiveness of said program for a period of one year and then determine the status of said program.

#### Dear Commissioners:

For approximately one year a group of commissioners have tried to persuade Sullivan County Commissioners, Departmental Heads, and public officials the importance of appropriating funds to place School Resource Officers in Sullivan County Middle schools. In order to validate and substantiate this concept, I will set forth the reasons and explanations that corroborate this belief.

#### 1. What is a SRO (School Resource Officer)?

He/She is a certified law enforcement officer who is permanently assigned to provide coverage to a school. The SRO is specifically trained to perform three roles:

- a) Law enforcement officer
- b) Law-related counselor and mentor, and
- c) Law-related teacher. The SRO is not necessarily a DARE officer or security guard assigned to a school for crisis intervention, but rather acts a comprehensive resource for the school.

### 2. What is the urgency of the hiring of SRO's?

- Recent incidents of violence and criminal behaviors have escalated on school premises, especially in the middle schools, on the national and local levels. Data generated by the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office states that the number of calls from middle schools have resulted n a total of 560 incidences since August 2005 to November 2006 in which an officer was dispatched to the specific school. Traffic violations were part of this total number, but the majority of calls were due to assaults, drug violations, possession of lethal weapons and other serious misbehavior.
- Sullivan County Board of Education and other systems have installed security cameras, mandated the use of school passes, provided training for staff development, initiated one door entrances and implemented many programs on substance abuse, conflict resolution and effective decision-making. However, school violence and serious juvenile crime continues to increase. The National Center for Juvenile Justice reports that 90% of the schools that utilize SRO's have reported a significant reduction in school violence and drug activity, while enhancing instructional learning.

## 3. What are some logical reasons for the placement of an SRO's in our middle schools?

- a. If the mere presence of an SRO or law enforcement agency cruiser saves one life or prevents a student from being physically assaulted or emotionally scarred, the dividends of placement of a SRO could never be measured.
- b. The cost for keeping an inmate in the Sullivan County jail is approximately \$12,000. If the presence or influence of one officer could keep one student from entering a life of crime, the investment would be justified financially.
- c. Program would than be more than cost effective if the time and expense were calculated by the dispatching of law enforcement officers and their vehicle to school premises.
- d. The placement of SRO's would not only establish a more positive approach between law enforcement and young people, but foster a safer learning environment and improve instructional time
- e. Determent of substance use, reduction in violence, and a general reduction in juvenile crime would be the immediate results of this program.
- f. SRO's would be positive role model who interact with students in a supportive manner.

## 4. How would the programs effectiveness be measured?

The effectiveness of the SRO program would be informally measured through the
monitoring of juvenile crime, school violence, and criminal incidents through the
coordinated efforts of the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office and the Sullivan County Board
of Education

Your consideration and approval of this resolution would reaffirm that we believe the safety of our students is of utmost importance.

# **CODE OF ETHICS**

2005

#### I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

The Board of Directors of the Sullivan County Economic Development Partnership (the "Partnership") has adopted this Code of Ethics to provide our partners, directors, employees, vendors, and members of the general public with an official statement of the fundamental principles that govern how the Partnership will conduct its business.

Under the Code, our directors and employees should conduct business for the Partnership in the full spirit of honest, ethical and lawful behavior and should not cause another director or employee or non-employee to act otherwise, either through inducement, suggestion or coercion. The purpose of this Code is to promote: (1) honest and ethical conduct, including the ethical handling of conflicts of interest and (2) compliance with applicable laws, rules and regulations.

This Code applies to all directors and employees of the Partnership. All directors and employees should be familiar with the Code. All directors and employees will be asked annually to read and sign the Code. This Code is not a contract (express or implied) but rather a pronouncement of the Partnership's desire to promote exemplary ethical behavior by its employees, officers, directors and agents in the conduct of all of Partnership business.

#### II. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Employees and directors of the Partnership must avoid situations where their personal interests could conflict or appear to conflict with the interests of the Partnership. Conflicts of interest may arise when an individual's position or responsibilities with the corporation present an opportunity for personal gain apart from the normal compensation an employee receives through employment. To help avoid conflicts (and the appearance thereof), the following guidelines have been developed.

#### Use of Corporate Funds and Assets

The assets of the Partnership are much more than our offices, furnishings, equipment, cash deposits, funds, computers and other tangible items. The Partnership's assets include prospective client lists, marketing concepts, business strategies and plans, investment and development programs, as well as information about our business. These assets may not be improperly used to provide personal gain for employees. Nor may employees provide others with the assets of the Partnership. The theft or diversion of money, property or other assets will not be tolerated.

#### Confidential Information

As part of your job, you may have access to confidential information about the Partnership and our clients, vendors, business partners and business prospects. Unless properly released to the public, this information should not be disclosed to fellow employees who do not have a business need to know or to non-employees for any reason, except in accordance with established corporate procedures. Confidential information of this sort includes information or data on business prospects, potential economic development projects, business strategies, acquisitions, client information, our partnership manuals, processes, systems, procedures, and our financial and other proprietary information. Much of

the financial information the Partnership may have from time to time about business prospects and our existing business partners and contacts is subject to their legal rights to privacy, and our privacy and confidentiality policies must be strictly adhered to preserve these rights. The duty to protect the confidences of the Partnership and its clients includes avoiding not only intentional disclosures but also taking care to avoid unintentional or indirect disclosure.

#### Personal Financial Gain

Directors and employees should avoid any outside financial interests that might interfere or unduly influence their corporate decisions or actions on behalf of the Partnership. This does not prohibit investments in or relationships with other companies that compete with or do business with the Partnership so long as the investment or relationship does not interfere with the director or employee's exercise of independent judgment in fulfilling responsibilities to the Partnership.

If you feel you may have a conflict of interest due to your non-Partnership investments, you should seek guidance from the Partnership's Executive Committee.

#### **Outside Activities**

Employees should avoid outside employment or activities that would have a negative impact on their job performance with the Partnership, or which are likely to conflict with their obligations to the Partnership. No employee may engage in personal activities that conflict with the best interests of the Partnership or our clients. An employee who performs work for a company with which the Partnership does business or competes with must disclose that interest or work to the Partnership's Executive Director.

#### Corporate Opportunities

Any opportunity for personal investment which comes to the attention of any employee or director of the Partnership and which in any way relates to or might involve the business plans, strategies or opportunities of the Partnership is considered a "corporate opportunity." Each employee and director is prohibited from using his or her position to take advantage of a "corporate opportunity" that properly belongs to the Partnership, whether or not the corporate opportunity is discovered through the performance of duties to the Partnership. Similarly, an employee or director may not appropriate a "corporate opportunity" for the benefit of his family members, business associates or his or their business organization.

#### Disclosure and Abstention

Each employee and director is expected to disclose any actual or potential conflict of interest at the earliest possible date and in a manner sufficient to enable the Partnership to assess the ramifications of such conflict of interest. Each employee's disclosure should be made to the Executive Director. Each director's disclosure should be made to the Chairman of the Board. As required by applicable law, each employee involved in an actual or potential conflict of interest situation must refrain from any attempt to influence the decision of the Partnership with regard to such matter. Each director must

abstain from any discussions or deliberations of the Board of Directors and must abstain from voting or attempting to influence the vote of the Board of Directors on any matter in which he has or may have any form of personal interest, whether financial or otherwise.

#### III. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

In the fulfillment of their responsibilities to the Partnership, all employees and directors are required to conduct themselves in a professional and ethical manner to promote the Partnership's compliance with laws of federal, state and local governments applicable to the Partnership as well as the rules and regulations of private and public regulatory agencies having jurisdiction over the Partnership. From time to time, the Partnership may implement policies and procedures designed to ensure compliance with laws and regulations, and employees should make every effort to abide by these policies and procedures at all times.

#### IV. DEALING WITH CLIENTS AND VENDORS

The following guidelines are intended to help all employees make the appropriate decision in potentially difficult or confusing situations.

#### "Kickbacks" and Rebates

No employee or director may accept, for themselves or their family members or their respective business organizations, any personal kickbacks, rebates or other payments (regardless of form, whether in money, property or services) which are in any way connected to or result from any business activities of the Partnership.

#### Gifts and Entertainment

To avoid both the reality and the appearance of improper relations with business contacts, clients or vendors, the following standards apply to receipt of gifts and entertainment by directors and employees of the Partnership:

#### Gifts

- You may not accept gifts of money under any circumstances nor may you solicit non-money
  gifts, gratuities, or any other personal benefit or favor of any kind from any business, firm or
  individual doing or seeking to do business with the Partnership.
- You and members of your immediate family may accept unsolicited, non-money gifls from a business, firm or individual doing or seeking to do business with the Partnership but only if:

   the gift is of nominal intrinsic value;
   the gift is advertising or promotional material; or
   the gift is reasonable under the circumstances and otherwise complies with any Partnership policies and procedures that may be applicable to you.

#### Entertainment

- Directors and employees may offer and/or accept meals, invitations to athletic events and other entertainment to or from business contacts, clients or prospective clients if the entertainment is of reasonable value, appropriate in the context of your position with the Partnership and the Partnership's business objectives, and in accordance with applicable Partnership policies. Employees should not, however, encourage or solicit entertainment from a business, firm or individual because they are doing or seeking to do business with the Partnership.
- Employees will be reimbursed for entertainment expenses only in accordance with Partnership policies and procedures as in effect from time to time.

#### Payments to Brokers, Agents, Consultants

Agreements with brokers, agents, sales representatives, and consultants must be in writing and must clearly and accurately set forth the services to be performed, the basis for earning the commission or fee involved, and the applicable rate or fee. Payments must be reasonable in amount and commensurate with the value of services rendered.

#### V. FINANCIAL BOOKS AND RECORDS

False or artificial entries shall not be made in the books or records of the Partnership for any reason; to do so may result in criminal and/or civil penalties to the Partnership and/or employee. No employee may engage in an arrangement that in any way may be interpreted or construed as misstating or otherwise concealing the nature or purpose of any entries in the financial books and records of the Partnership.

#### Falsification of Records

No payment or receipt on behalf of the Partnership may be approved or made with the intention or understanding that any part of the payment or receipt is to be used for a purpose other than that described in the documents supporting the transaction. "Slush funds" or similar funds or accounts where no accounting for receipts or expenditures is made on the Partnership's books are strictly prohibited.

#### Retention of Records

All employees must comply with the Partnership's records retention policies. Destruction, concealment or falsification of any documents required by law to be retained is strictly prohibited.

#### VI. FAIR DEALING

All employees and directors of the Partnership must uphold the highest standards of fair, honest and ethical conduct in all business dealings with our clients and business contacts, with other employees, with vendors and partners, and with the general public.

#### Information About Competing Projects or Opportunities

As a participant in the economic development of Sullivan County, Tennessee, the Partnership seeks knowledge about other economic development projects or opportunities which might be competitive with the Partnership. However, we will not engage in illegal or improper acts to acquire such information.

#### VII. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS

The Partnership encourages each of its employees to be good citizens and to fully participate in the political process. Employees should, however, be aware that: (1) federal law prohibits the Partnership from contributing to federal political candidates, political parties or party officials; and (2) employees who participate in partisan political activities must make every effort to ensure that they do not leave the impression that they speak or act for the Partnership.

#### VIII. ENFORCEMENT

#### **Board of Directors**

The Board of Directors of the Partnership is responsible in its oversight role to assure that the business practices of the Partnership are conducted in accordance with this Code of Ethics.

In all cases, the Partnership Board of Directors will assure that the legal rights of individuals are protected, that the Partnership's legal obligations are fulfilled, and that proper disciplinary and legal action is taken if violations occur. The Board of Directors will also see that corrective measures are taken consistently and safeguards are instituted to prevent recurrence of violations.

#### Reporting of Violations

As a Partnership employee, you are expected to report without delay all unethical, dishonest or illegal activities or financial improprieties by other employees. Employees are encouraged to contact the Chief Executive Officer, the Chairman of the Partnership Board of Directors, or the Executive Committee with any concerns about wrongdoing or questionable practices of any kind within the Partnership. Submission of Code violations may be made in person or in writing to any of the above mentioned persons and must include a description of the factual basis for the allegations (e.g., documents, meetings, communications and other events). The Partnership reserves the right to require that any report be reduced to writing. Each written report must be dated and signed by the person making the report.

#### Failure to Report

Failure to submit information regarding suspected Code violations is itself a violation of this Code as is the submission of facts which are known to be false.

#### No Retaliation

It is a serious Code violation, and a violation of law, for any director or employee to initiate or encourage reprisal action against an employee or other person who in good faith reports known or suspected Code violations. Retaliation will not be tolerated.

#### Chief Executive Officer and Managers

The Chief Executive Officer and other managers of the Partnership are responsible for advocating full compliance with the Code by all personnel and are required to report any actual or alleged material Code violations and any potential wrongdoing or financial improprieties. The Chief Executive Officer and other managers are also responsible for reviewing this Code with employees under their supervision and ensuring that it is countersigned annually and placed in the employee's personnel file. New employees must read and sign the Code as a part of beginning employment with the Partnership.

#### Request for Waivers and Exceptions

Waivers or exceptions to this Code of Ethics, if any, may only be granted by the Partnership Board of Directors, or an appropriate independent committee of the Board. Any waivers of or exceptions to this Code will be publicly disclosed on a timely basis and will include an explanation for any such waiver or exception. In addition, any changes to this Code of Ethics will be publicly disclosed on a timely basis.

#### Penalties

Violations of this Code of Ethics are a serious matter and will be the basis for disciplinary action, including reprimand, loss of compensation, seniority or promotional opportunities, demotions or dismissal. Suspected and reported violations will be investigated and any violation will be dealt with fairly.

#### IX. EMPLOYEE STATEMENT

I acknowledge having received a copy of the Partnership's Code of Ethics. I have read it completely and reviewed it with my immediate supervisor.

I understand how the Code applies to me and agree to fully comply with each of its provisions.

I understand that the Code is not intended to set forth either express or implied contractual obligations of the Partnership. The Partnership retains the right to change the provisions of this Code at any time.
