The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made and the loan shall be paid out of revenue of the fund for which the money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the authority of Sections 5-10-501 to 5-10-509, inclusive, T.C.A. said notes shall be signed by the County Executive and counter signed by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 1988.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in            Called            Session on the 28th day of May, 1987.

THAT the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners approves an act to provide for the creation of a consolidated government charter commission for Sullivan County, Tennessee, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 7-2-101(3).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 7-2-101(3), there shall be created a consolidated government charter commission for Sullivan County, Tennessee, its principal city, the city of Kingsport, Tennessee, and its smaller cities, the city of Bristol, Tennessee, and the city of Bluff City, Tennessee.

SECTION 2. The consolidated charter commission shall be composed of twenty (20) members. Four (4) members shall be representatives from the City of Kingsport, Tennessee; four (4) members shall be representatives of Bristol, Tennessee; one (1) member shall be a representative of Bluff City, Tennessee; and eleven (11) members shall be representatives from Sullivan County, Tennessee. The respective governing bodies of each of the cities and the county shall elect the members of the consolidated charter commission within thirty (30) days after this act shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 4; provided, however, that no member of the metropolitan government study commission shall be a member of the consolidated charter commission. Should any governing body charged with electing a representative to the consolidated charter commission fail to elect the representative within the thirty (30) day period allowed, the county commission of Sullivan County shall elect a qualified representative.

SECTION 3. Except as otherwise provided in this act, the creation, organization, powers, duties, and all other matters relating to the consolidated charter commission shall be as those are defined in Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 7, relating to consolidated government.

SECTION 4. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of each of the governing bodies of the county of Sullivan, Tennessee, city of Kingsport, Tennessee, city of Bristol, Tennessee, and city of Bluff City, Tennessee, before July 4, 1987. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of each governing body and certified by him to the secretary of state.

SECTION 5. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall be come effective upon being approved as provided in Section 4.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee (the "County"), did on April 20, 1987, adopt a resolution authorizing the issuance of \$2,000,000 General Obligation Public Works Bonds, Series 1987 (the "Bonds") to finance the following:

- (1) construction of the Blountville Justice Complex; and
- (2) completion of the construction of the Sullivan County Jail; and
- (3) renovation of the County courthouse and furnishing of the Blountville Justice Complex

and to pay the costs of issuance of the Bonds, including the payment of legal, fiscal, administrative and printing costs incident thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Bonds have been advertised for public sale on May 20, 1987, in The Bond Buyer, a daily financial newspaper printed and published in New York, New York, and on May 16, 1987, in the Kingsport Times, a newspaper of general circulation in the County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Notice of Sale, hereinabove described, duly published in accordance with Tennessee law, the following bids were received for the Bonds, copies of which bids are attached hereto:
