To the Honorable Steve M. Godsey, Mayor of Sullivan County, and the Board of Sullivan County Commissioners meeting in Regular Session this 15th day of December, 2008.

RESOLUTION To Improve Fire Safety Within The Borders Of Sullivan County

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has the obligation to our citizens to improve fire safety; and

WHEREAS, Sullivan County has no standards on the size of water service lines or the placement of fire hydrants serviced by any public utility provider; and

WHEREAS, there are areas within the borders of Sullivan County with insufficient supply line sizing and lack of sufficient fire hydrants for adequate fire safety.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular Session hereby require all water utilities within the County, including all municipalities, to install fire hydrants and supply lines in all new, replacement, and upgrade construction to the standards required within residential areas inside the city limits of Kingsport or Bristol, Tennessee; and these be checked and maintained on a regular basis on a schedule no less than what's provided within the boundaries of the cities.

BE II FURTHER RESOLVED that if any utility provides service to an industrial park or other major industrial site, sufficient water supply, line sizing and fire hydrants must be installed to meet or exceed any codes required within the city limits of Kingsport, Bristol, Tennessee, or any other utility district providing service in Sullivan County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that money to help-facilitate this resolution be earmarked from the Health and Safety Program or Homeland Security Program in an amount no less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) annually and be dedicated to the rural portions of the County that have utility supplied water service and an insufficient supply line sizing or an insufficient number of fire hydrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$5,000 annually be put in each year's budget to help facilitate this resolution. This money is to be put in the Health & Safety program overall Planning & Zoning Department's Budget. The \$5,000 annually to be dedicated to the rural portions of the County that have utility supplied water service and no fire hydrants or an insufficient number of fire hydrants.

The resulting reduction in personnel cost will be reallocated to the respective department's budget for other services.
- SECTION 3. A lump sum payment not to exceed \$10,000 will be provided to each employee accepting the incentive based upon credit attained in the TCRS System of 55 years of age with at least 25 years of service.
- SECTION 5. A lump sum payment not to exceed \$ 5,000 will be provided to each employee accepting the incentive based upon credit attained in the TCRS System of 65 years of age with at least 10 years of service.

SECTION 6. Payment is subject to the appropriate withholdings and will be paid out on the scheduled payroll for the employee's last workday along with any unpaid vacation, personal days and any comp-time due.

SECTION 7. This incentive program will be offered to all employees within the participating departments that have the designated years of service (TCRS) for participation in this program as of the first work day of the month after the passage of this resolution. Nov. 2 "

SECTION 8. The employees must have submitted their signed letter of intent to their department head with a copy filed with the payroll office by the last work day of the first full calendar month after passage of this resolution. This letter is Nov. 25th irrevocable.

Dead is Private First Class Roy W. Neal, 21, son of Mrs. Herman Neal, Route 3, Blountville, and the late Mr. Neal. His family was notified of his Tuesday death by a telegram

A military policeman, Neal had been in Vietnam since November of 1967 after undergoing basic training at Ft. Benning, Ga. 'He had been named "Soldier Of The Month" for April by the men of the battalion with which he served.

A 1965 graduate of Blountville High School, Neal was voted the most valuable basketball player during his semior year. He also was a member of the varsity basketball team his sophomore and junior years an high school.

Neal, who had attended Milligan College, Milligan, Tenn., and was enrolled at East Tennessee State University, Johnson City, Tenn., prior to entering the service in June of 1967, was employed by Mason-Dixon Lines during summer vacations.

A native of Sullivan County, he was a member of the Blountville Christian Church.

Survivors, in addition to his mother, include two sisters, Miss Joyce Neal and Miss Becky Neal, both of Route 3, Blountville; his maternal grandfather, I Roy Hudson, Piney F I at s. Tenn; and several audis and uncles.

Private First Class Neal distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous actions on 28 May 1968, while serving as a member of a Military Police convoy security patrol in the vicinity of Thu Duc, Republic of Vietnam. While the convoy was proceeding south toward Saigon, Republic of Vietnam, it came under attack from an unknown size enemy force. In an effort to protect the convoy and reduce the enemy threat, Private Neal directed accurate fire from his machine gun until his ammunition was exhausted. He had begun firing his sidearm when an anti-tank round destroyed his vehicle, killing him and two other Military Policeman. Private First Class Neal's heroic actions were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, the Military Police Corps and the United States Army.
