RESOLUTION making findings and determinations preliminary to the issuance of single family mortgage revenue bonds by Sullivan County on behalf of Hawkins County, Tennessee, and providing for a public hearing on such findings and determinations and the issuance of said bonds.

whereas there exists in Hawkins County, Tennessee a seriously inadequate supply of decent, safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations for persons and families of lower and moderate income, which condition is contrary to the public interest and threatens the health, safety, welfare, comfort and security of the people of said county and is inimical to the sound growth and development of said county and the communities therein; and

WHEREAS in order to ameliorate the foregoing conditions Tennessee counties are authorized by the "Tennessee Home Mortgage Act," being Sections 7-60-101 to 7-60-217, inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Act"), to borrow money and issue bonds to defray the costs of purchasing or funding the making of home mortgages to persons and families of lower or moderate income; and

WHEREAS pursuant to resolution adopted by its county legislative body on first reading on October 20, 1980, Hawkins County has made the findings and determinations required by the Act; and

WHEREAS pursuant to such resolution of October 27, 1980 Sullivan County (the "County") has been requested by Hawkins County to issue revenue bonds of the County on behalf of Hawkins County, all for the purpose of defraying the costs of purchasing or funding the making of home mortgages to persons and families of lower or moderate income in Hawkins County; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 7-60-217 of the Act the County is empowered to cooperate with any other county or counties in taking all actions deemed by such county or counties to be necessary or proper to effectuate the purposes of the Act to the greatest advantage of the citizens of the State of Tennessee through coordination of the exercise of the powers granted under the Act; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 5-1-114, Tennessee Code Annotated, the county legislative bodies of any two or more contiguous counties are empowered to enter into such agreements as they may deem necessary and desirable in order to provide for the joint conducting or financing of any of the functions or services rendered by or through the county government; and

WHEREAS pursuant to said Section 5-1-114 any county legislative body is empowered to enter into such agreements as may be deemed necessary or desirable for said county to have any one or more of its services or functions performed by and through the offices and officials of another county legislative body, and any county legislative body is authorized

to enter into such agreements as may be deemed desirable or necessary to permit the offices and officials of such county legislative body to perform the said services or functions for another county or counties; and

WHEREAS this county legislative body has heretofore adopted a resolution making findings and determinations under the Act and proposes to issue its revenue bonds under the Act so as to carry out a program of financing home mortgages in the County for persons and families of lower or moderate income (the "Program"); and

WHEREAS the issuance of said bonds on behalf of Hawkins County will be to the advantage of the citizens of both Sullivan County and Hawkins County as it will permit the issuance of bonds that will be more attractive to potential purchasers thereof and will reduce the costs attendant upon the issuance of such bonds:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, acting as the county legislative body of said county, as follows:

Section 1. It is hereby found and determined that conditions substantially as described in 7-60-102 of the Act exist in Hawkins County, are continuing and may be ameliorated by the exercise of the powers granted under the Act.

- (a) persons and families of lower and moderate income of Hawkins County are subject to hardship in finding and financing through private banking channels decent, safe and sanitary housing;
- (b) private enterprise is not adequately meeting the need for providing and financing decent, safe and sanitary housing for such persons and families and the reduction of blight and deterioration;
- (c) there exist in Hawkins County conditions of blight and the deterioration of the quality of the environment and living conditions in Hawkins County;

- (d) conditions of unemployment and underemployment exist in the construction industry in Hawkins County;
- (e) the conditions of unemployment and underemployment and the need for decent, safe and sanitary housing will be diminished and the blight and the deterioration of the quality of the environment and living conditions in Hawkins County will be alleviated by the exercise and full implementation of the powers granted under the Act.

Section 3. A public hearing on the findings and determinations herein made together with a public hearing on the issuance of single family mortgage revenue bonds by the County in the principal amount of not exceeding \$15,000,000 for the purpose of carrying out a Program of financing home mortgages in Hawkins County for persons and families of lower or moderate income, shall be held in the County on December 1st , 1980 after which this resolution will be submitted for final consideration. Not less than 30 days prior to such public hearing a notice thereof shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County.

Section 4. The County Executive and County Clerk are hereby authorized to enter into and to execute an interlocal cooperation agreement and such other agreements with Hawkins County or such other documents as may be necessary or desirable to effectuate the issuance of bonds by the County and the expenditure of the proceeds for the purposes herein expressed.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect from and upon its passage following final consideration, the public welfare requiring it.

RESOLUTION electing to come under the provisions of the Tennessee Home Mortgage Act, making findings and determinations preliminary to the issuance of single family mortgage revenue bonds and providing for a public hearing on such findings and determinations and the issuance of said bonds.

WHEREAS there exists in Sullivan County (the "County") a seriously inadequate supply of decent, safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations for persons and families of lower and moderate income, which condition is contrary to the public interest and threatens the health, safety, welfare, comfort and security of the people of the County and is inimical to the sound growth and development of the County and the communities therein; and

WHEREAS numerous hearings and conferences have been held by the officials of the County with respect to appropriate actions to be taken to alleviate the foregoing conditions; and

WHEREAS the County is authorized by the "Tennessee Home Mortgage Act," being Sections 7-60-101 to 7-60-217 inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Act") to borrow money and issue bonds to defray the costs of purchasing or funding the making of home mortgages to persons and families of lower or moderate income; and

WHEREAS it is desired by the County to come under the provisions of the Act as permitted by Section 6-60-103(5) thereof; and

WHEREAS no powers granted to the County by the Act may be exercised thereunder until the County shall have made certain findings and determinations:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Sullivan County, Tennessee, acting as the county legislative body of said county, as follows:

 $\frac{\text{Section 1.}}{\text{provisions of the Act as permitted by Section}}$  under the provisions of the Act as permitted by Section 7-60-103(5) thereof.

Section 2. It is hereby found and determined that conditions substantially as described in §7-60-102 of the Act exist in the County, are continuing and may be ameliorated by the exercise of the powers granted under the Act.

Section 3. It is further found and determined as follows:

(a) persons and families of lower and moderate income of the County are subject to hardship in finding and financing through private banking channels decent, safe and sanitary housing;

- (b) private enterprise is not adequately meeting the need for providing and financing decent, safe and sanitary housing for such persons and families and the reduction of blight and deterioration;
- (c) there exist in the County conditions of blight and the deterioration of the quality of the environment and living conditions in the County;
- (d) conditions of unemployment and underemployment exist in the construction industry in the County;
- (e) the conditions of unemployment and underemployment and the need for decent, safe and sanitary housing will be diminished and the blight and the deterioration of the quality of the environment and living conditions in the County will be alleviated by the exercise and full implementation of the powers granted under the Act.

Section 4. A public hearing on the findings and determinations herein made together with a public hearing on the issuance of single family mortgage revenue bonds in the principal amount of not exceeding \$60,000,000 shall be held in the County on December 1st, 1980, after which this resolution will be submitted for final consideration. Not less than 30 days prior to such public hearing a notice thereof shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect from and upon its passage following final consideration, the public welfare requiring it.

### PETITION OF HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER OF SULLIVAN COUNTY JOINED BY TENNESSEE EASTMAN COMPANY

Petitioners would respectfully show to the Court as follows:

- 1. By reason of the acquisition of major portions of the property on the southeastern end of Long Island, near Kingsport, Tennessee, by Eastman Kodak Company, for present or future industrial use, and by reason of the deterioration of residences which were formerly located on lots in that are: there has been a substantial decrease in the number of properties in residential use and a corresponding decrease in the number of persons who use the streets and roads in that area, a number of said streets and roads having been heretofore closed and abandoned. Other streets and roads in the area are no longer necessary for the public use, and, for reasons hereinafter set out, it would be in the public interest that same be abandoned, through proper legal procedures.
- 2. The undersigned Highway Commissioner of Sullivan County avers that he has inspected the area shown on the map attached hereto, near the southeastern end of Long Island, and recommends that the portions of Circle Drive, Clark Street, and Niagara Street, marked in "Blue" on the map of sai

area attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and made a part hereof, should be closed, that the public rights therein should be extinguished and abandoned, and that the incidental rights of those persons owning property in said area, to the extent that such rights exist under the law, should be terminated, and that any who may be damaged by such termination should be compensated as by law provided. The particular properties (and the names and addresses of the owners thereof so far as they have been determined) which may be affected by the closing of said portions of said streets or roads are shown on the list appended as Exhibit 2 to this Petition, for the purpose of enabling appropriate notice of this proceeding.

- 3. The undersigned Highway Commissioner of Sullivan County further avers, on information and belief, that the closing of the portions of said streets or roads shown on Exhibit 1 does not in fact impair the ingress and egress of any of the owners of the properties in the vicinity, there being alternate and superior routes to said properties which remain unaffected. The closing of said portions of said streets and roads serves a public interest in the following respects:
  - (a) The cost of maintenance and improvement of said streets or roads is eliminated.
  - (b) The non-residential area adjoining said streets or roads will cease to be affected by unlawful activities which may occur in an isolated nonresidential area, and the cost of policing said areas will be eliminated.
  - (c) Traffic hazards created by major industrial use of the property near and adjacent to the portions of said streets or roads to be closed will be eliminated.

As a major incidental benefit to the closing of said portions of

said streets or roads, the termination of the public and private easements will enable the area occupied by said streets or roads to be combined with the adjacent property of the Industry owning same, facilitating major industrial development within the area which will provide substantial tax revenues to the County, additional employment to its citizens, and numerous other collateral benefits to the community from the manufacturing operation.

- 4. The portions of the streets or roads shown on Exhibit 1 which are to be closed, in which the public rights are to be abandoned, and in which the private rights, to the extent that they may exist, are to be terminated, are further described as follows:
  - (a) A section of Clark Street extending from the westerly sideline of Circle Drive approximately 100 feet to the easterly sideline of Lot "O", L. E. Clark Subdivision of Lot 51 and 52, Block 12, Long Island Gardens.
  - (b) A section of Niagara Street extending from the westerly sideline of Circle Drive approximately 71.25 feet to the westerly sideline of that portion of Lot 11 of the Leeper and Bowles re-subdivision of Lots 43-50, Block 12, Long Island Gardens, presently owned by Eastman Kodak Company.
  - (c) A section of Circle Drive extending from the southerly sideline of Clark Street approximately 1220 feet to the southerly sideline of that part of Lot 71, Block 13, Long Island Gardens, not presently owned by Eastman Kodak Company.
- 5. Eastman Kodak Company, the sole owner of property directly abutting on said portions of said streets or roads, joins in this Petition for the purpose of requesting the action which the Highway Commissioner of Sullivan County has recommended, and of consenting to the abandonment of public rights.

and waiving any right to compensation for its rights as abutting owner. Also, because of the incidental private benefit which it may derive from this proceeding, and in the desire that there be no cost to Sullivan County by reason of the action recommended by the Highway Commissioner, Eastman Kodak Company agrees that it will reimburse the County any cost incident to this proceeding, including award of incidental damages, if any, to the owners of property which might be determined to be affected by the closing in such manner as to entitle them, under the law, to be compensated.

- 6. This proceeding is filed pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Sections 54-10-201, et seq., as modified by Chapter 201, Tennessee Private Acts of 1929.
- 7. THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, PETITIONERS RESPECTFULLY REQUEST THE FOLLOWING:
- (a) That notice of this proceeding be served upon the owners of property which may be affected thereby, within the contemplation of law, as provided by Section 6, Chapter 201, Tennessee Private Acts of 1929.
- (b) That the County Judge or Chairman of the County Commission appoint three (3) disinterested householders or freeholders and citizens of the County to serve as Commissioners to perform the duties prescribed by Section 6, Chapter 201, Tennessee Private Acts of 1929, and the general law, in the manner therein provided, in due course reporting their action to the Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners.
  - (c) That this Petition be meanwhile considered by the Sullivan

County Planning Commission, and the Executive Committee of the Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners, in keeping with the custom of the Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners in such cases, to the end that their recommendations may be made to the Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners.

(d) That in due course the Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners take formal action to abandon the public rights in the portions of the streets or roads hereinabove identified, and to terminate any private rights of persons other than Eastman Kodak Company which may exist therein, in the manner and on the conditions by law provided.


