BE IT RESOLVED THAT WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Ambulance Service has been in operation for nine years with no increase in rates charged. These rates are:

\$15 for convalescent call \$25 for an emergency call .50¢ per mile for out-of-county trips with a \$15 pickup charge

WHEREAS, the cost of operating the ambulance service has increased by 2½ times since beginning operation (\$117,000 in 1971-72----\$285,000 in 1979-80) and the operating deficit is currently \$200,000 annually.

NOW BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Sullivan County Ambulance Service rates be increased as follows:

\$25.00 for Convalescent runs \$40.00 for emergency runs .70¢ per mile (one way) for out-of-county trips up to 200 miles; \$1.00 per mile for trips exceeding 200 miles. Pickup charge remains at \$15.00.

10. RESOLUTION IN RE:

PLANNING COMMISSION UNDER TCA 49-415 THROUGH 49-429

BE IT RESOLVED THAT WHEREAS, the Peabody Report of October, 1973, on the Sullivan County, Kingsport, and Bristol Public Schools states that many needed improvements could be achieved more effectively through cooperative efforts of the three school systems, but that merger could produce greater advantages if that merger is properly and carefully brought about, and,

WHEREAS, the Citizens Committee to Study County Government Report of May 9, 1979, recommends that (1) the merger of the current school systems in Sullivan County and (2) that a Planning Commission under TCA 49-415 through 49-429 be appointed, and.

WHEREAS, the Sullivan County Court passed a resolution entitled "Planning Commission Under TCA 49-415 through 49-429 on April 19, 1976, by a 38-5 roll call vote which reads as follows: "BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Sullivan County Court go on record as favoring the creation of a Planning Commission under TCA Sections 49-415 through 49-429 for the purpose of studying and considering the need for and problems in conjunction with the consolidation of all public schools within the county into a unified school system and making and filing a written report as provided by said code sections. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the County Judge make his apointments under TCA 49-416 and that he invites those empowered to make appointments under this code section to make them. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT if this resolution is passed and the Planning Commission is appointed as provided, that the Commission be requested to complete its study and file its report as quickly as possible and at a much earlier date that the time allowed by the Code. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the passage of this resolution does not indicate favor or disfavor of the consolidation of all public schools within the county into a unified school system.", and,

WHEREAS, following the requirements of the TCA, the County Judge, the Mayor of Bristol, the Mayor of Kingsport, the Chairman of the Bristol School Board, the Chairman of the Kingsport School Board, and, the Chairman of the Sullivan County School Board, would each appoint five (5) members to this commission, and,

WHEREAS, at the time of the introduction of this resolution, over three years sin the original resolution was passed, none of the 30 member commission has been appointed, and,

WHEREAS, such a study as set out by the code would be even another way of getting the pluses and minuses of consolidation and offering us a plan for implementing consolidation if the affected school systems, governments, and voters decide they want it, and is the way the Tennessee Code provides it must be done even if we had a 1,000 studies, and the commission can take advantage of any previous studies, and.

WHEREAS, there should be no fears that making such a study would mean consolidation, since there are many stages at which it could be rejected (by any one of the three school boards, by any one of the three governmental bodies, and by any one of the referendums required in each of the two cities and in the county area outside the cities), and,

WHEREAS, even though this Board of County Commissioners has initiated steps that could lead to the establishment of a Metro Charter Commission and perhaps eventual consolidation of all four of the present governmental bodies within Sullivan County, there would be nothing inconsistent or out of harmony with working toward merger of an individual governmental function or functions among the present governmental bodie in Sullivan County pending complete consolidation, if it is ever achieved. The individual advantages could already be realized long before complete consolidatic and easily absorbed into complete consolidation if and when it does occur.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT attention be brought to bear on this matter (the purpose of this present resolution) for the needed action on the already passed and standing resolution, and in order to give impetus and momentum to the appointments that the County Judge make his appointments first before renewing his invitations to those others required to make appointments.

OF AUTOMOBILE GRAVEYARDS FOR SULLIVAN
COUNTY, TENNESSEE

BE IT RESOLVED THAT WHEREAS, the County Commission has passed a resolution asking the Sullivan County Legislative Delegation to the General Assembly for the adoption of a private act concerning the regulation and licensing of automobile graveyards in Sullivan County, Tennessee.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT when the legislative delegation officially passes this private act the Sullivan County Board of Commissioners immediately adopt the following regulations in order that they may enforce said private act.

ALSO, BE IT UNDERSTOOD Sullivan County "Automobile Graveyard" as defined: Means any lot or place which is exposed to the weather and upon which more than five (5) motor vehicles of any kind incapable of being operated and which it would not be

economically practical to make operative, are placed, located, or found. "Automo! .e Junkyard" shall be construed to mean establishments having permanent facilities to crush cars. The above operation must also sell parts from unoperative cars on said lot before crushing them. Let it Further Be Understood that "Automobile Junkyards" shall not be construed to mean: car auction companies, automobile renting and leasin companies, automobile repair and service companies, automobile used car dealers, gaso line service stations or automobile storage companies.

- 1. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Sullivan County Tax Assessor's Office shall license said auto graveyards that are within 1,000 feet of Sullivan County roads, subdivisions, hospitals, churches or schools. It shall be the responsibility of said auto graveyard owners to submit a certified survey of the present and future boundaries of said graveyards to the Sullivan County Tax Assessor's Office within three months of passage of this county act.
- The above licensing agency shall:
 - A. Eliminate pollution problems caused by certain auto graveyards to lakes, streams and natural drains. The licensing agency shall require the owners to set back said automobiles 100 feet from such waterways.
 - B. For the sake of protection and safety the licensing agency shall require the automobile graveyard owners to erect a six-foot high chain link fence that will encompass the automobile graveyards.
 - . All said auto graveyards in Sullivan County will be given six months to comply with above regulations.
- 3. The enforcing agency of said auto graveyards shall be the Sullivan County She of Department.
- 4. Civil fines for violations of such regulations shall not be in excess of twenty-
- five (\$25) dollars per each violation.
 5. If subdivisions, hospitals, churches or schools are established or constructed next to auto graveyards the said graveyards shall not be required to re-locate their boundaries in order to meet the requirements of Section 1 of this instrument.

Dear Judge Boyd:

It was a pleasure to meet with you and Jim Fesmire in your office last week to discuss the extension of natural gas service to the Piney Flats Industrial Park. We feel the addition of natural gas service to this industrial park would add to its many other existing features and make it even more attractive as a site for industry.

United Cities Gas Company has budgeted capital expenditures in excess of \$750,000 for 1980 to improve and provide additional service to the Bristol-Sullivan County area. Included in this expenditure is approximately \$400,000 for the purpose of extending a six-inch high pressure steel main from a new delivery station near Blountville along Highway 37 to its point of intersection with Highway 11-E. The major purpose of this extension is to increase system capacity in the southern part of Bristol, an area that has developed very rapidly in the past few years.

We are anxious to provide natural gas service to the Piney Flats Industrial Park, and we have monitored the development of the area for the past few years to determine the time when it would be economically feasible to extend our system. A survey was recently completed of the existing industrial customers in the park to determine how much natural gas would be used by these customers. A copy of the survey is enclosed for your information. It appears that we could expect revenues of approximately \$400,000 per year from these customers. We do not feel that the present gas usage would justify our main extension during 1980.

Considering the desirability of having natural gas service available in the industrial park as an aid in attracting new industry, I would like to suggest the following plan. United Cities Gas Company would extend a main into the industrial park as shown on the enclosed map at its actual construction cost, not to exceed \$500,000. The County would advance to United Cities the cost of the proposed main extension. United Cities Gas Company would then enter into a contract with the County to refund annually, for a specific period of time, a sum equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of the gross margin from the sale of natural gas in the area -- the gross margin being the difference between the revenue and the cost of gas sold. At the present time, this margin is approximately \$.26 per dollar of revenue. Assuming that the industrial customers presently located in the park used natural gas, the County could expect approximately \$30,000 in the first year of service. Obviously, additional customers added to the system would increase this amount.

United Cities Gas Company is a natural gas distribution company with operations in six states. We presently serve over 50,000 customers and purchase our natural gas supply from six major interstate pipelines. Because of our diverse sources of supply and the many contacts we have in the industry, our company has a unique ability to meet its market requirements. We feel that our position in the industry would be a positive factor in aiding the County in the development of the industrial park.





It is our preliminary opinion that the cost of the work outlined on the attached sketch should not exceed \$20,000.00. We trust this information will be of assistance.




